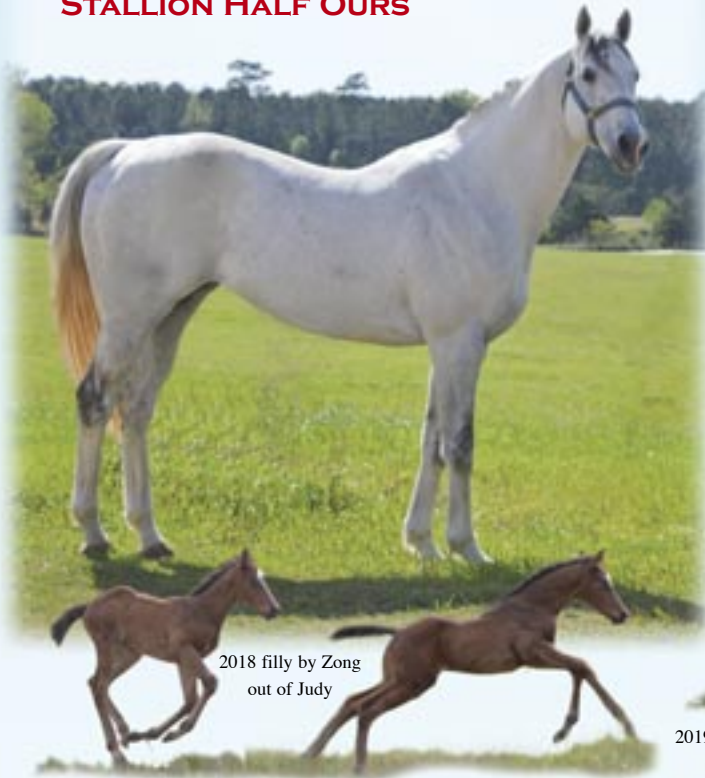

# Bill and Al Ulwelling

Father and son Bill and Al Ulwelling got into the thoroughbred business a little over a decade ago. After buying into a business partner's horse the Ulwellings began breeding and their efforts are paying off on the track.

In 2018 Remember Daisy (M i s r e m e m b e r e d - V e r y Speightstown) won three stakes in Louisiana. In February the filly won the Louisiana Premier Night Starlet at Delta Downs; then the Tom Benson Memorial Overnight Stakes at Fair Grounds in November, and Louisiana Champions Day Ladies Stakes in December, as well as placing in the Crescent City Oaks also at Fair Grounds. For the year, she earned

\$203,810. The now four-year-old filly has come back strong this season placing in the Lady Canterbury Stakes and the River Cities Stakes.

Another homebred for the Ulwellings, Shakopee Town (Jersey

Town-Shakopee) finished third in the Louisiana Champions Day Ladies as well as the Happy Ticket Stakes and won the 2018 Goldfinch Stakes at Prairie Meadows. Also making an impact in 2019, Shakopee Town won the G3 Whimsical Stakes Pre- sented at Woodbine.

Living in Minnesota, the Ulwellings visited Canterbury Park and began their racing operation there. After stepping back for a year to readjust the game plan, Al said he reached out to Canterbury trainer Mike Biehler, who later introduced the Ulwellings to trainer Gary Scherer while in Louisiana. The Ulwellings have had horses with Scherer ever since.

## BREEDING SHED

Keeping the Membership informed, LTBA President Warren J. Harang, III

The 2020 breeding season is approaching fast and I have good news for Louisiana Breeders. The LTBA Board of Directors voted, at their most recent meeting, to increase breeders awards for Louisiana Sired Louisiana Breds to 20% beginning with the 19-20 Delta Downs meet which is currently under way. The change is intended to give breeders incentive to choose among the many outstanding stallions that stand here in the state of Louisiana. Based on 2018 figures, the change could increase breeders awards paid out to Louisiana sired Louisiana breds by an estimated \$500,000 this year. You will soon be able to research options in the Louisiana Stallion Register which will be out right before Louisiana Champions Day.

There are already many outstanding early bird nominations to Louisiana Champions Day, which will run Saturday, December 14 at New Orleans Fair Grounds. Final nomination deadline is fast approaching. Be sure to get your entries in by November 15. This year will see the return of the Louisiana Champions Day Gala the night before the races, Friday, December 13. This year features a change of venue for the Gala. Traditionally held in the Fair Ground Clubhouse, the 2019 event will be held at Copeland Towers and is open to all members. The price of a ticket for non-members is \$55 a person. With an associate

LTBA membership costing only \$50, it only makes sense to join. In addition to all of the other great benefits of membership. I hope to see a great crowd at the Gala as well as the races which always highlight the best of Louisiana bred racing.

Louisiana breds continue to excel at the sales. A Louisiana Bred filly by Maclean's Music out of the Stormy Atlantic mare Sweet Jackie Jo was purchased by William and Corinne Heiligbrodt's East Hickman for \$145,000 to top the Sept. 5 Equine Sales of Louisiana's Consignor Select Yearling Sale in Opelousas, La. The sale topper, a half sister to two Louisiana bred stakes winners Actif Storm and Atchata, as well as multiple stakes-placed Nurse Goodnight, was bred in Louisiana by and consigned by 4M Ranch. A Louisiana-bred colt by champion Shanghai Bobby, topped the Texas Summer Yearling and Mixed Sale with a \$115,000 bid from Summer Grove Farm. Consigned by Clear Creek Stud LLC, agent, the March 5 foal is out of the winning Cobra King mare Viva Vega, who has produced eight winners including stakes winners Southern Dude and Viva Vegas.

Again this year, a retired Louisiana bred racehorse performed exceptionally in the Retired Racehorse Project Thoroughbred Makeover. Tenpin Sugar, a 2013

bay mare by Tenpins out of Storm Cat mare, Hurricane Amy won the show jumper division with trainer Katherine Deichmann. Bred in Louisiana by Emile J. Barras Farm Stables LLC. Tenpin Sugar earned \$7,586 in her racing career. The LTBA fully encourages participation in this program to give purpose to our thoroughbreds once their racing careers are over.

I am very pleased that Dr. Mike Strain won his re-election campaign and will continue as Commissioner of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry. Dr. Strain continues to be a strong advocate for our industry in Baton Rouge. Our elected officials do make a difference and I remind everyone to vote November 16th.

Encourage everyone to be actively involved in all aspects of our industry. Come to a board meeting; be informed and involved. Come to the races; bring your family and friends; the more interest we can generate, the better for all of us. "The more the merrier!" ## GEMOLOGIST

Variety is the spice of life, to recall an old adage. In equine populations, it is also needed to prevent the ill effects of continuous inbreeding, and yet the vast majority of Thoroughbred stallions today trace their male lines to one of just three progenitors: Northern Dancer, Mr. Prospector, and A.P. Indy.

Fortunately, Louisiana horsemen have a quality alternative available to them in Gemologist, who recently completed his first Louisiana season in 2019 and is the current leader of the Southwestern region's sire list. A big, handsome horse who was a Grade 1 winner on the track, he is coming up with surprisingly speedy runners as well as horses who are making their mark at the highest levels of competition.

A son of two-time Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner Tiznow, whose male line stretches back to the immortal Man o' War, Gemologist combines his out-cross male line with a potent concentration of Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector, two stallions whose descendants have crossed and recrossed with powerful results. Produced from the Mr. Prospector mare Crystal Shard, he is a half brother to listed stakes winner Clear Destiny (by Deputy Minister) and to Clear Thinking (by Awesome Again), dam of 2018 Monmouth Oaks (G3) winner Skeptic (by Tiznow) and Korean listed stakes winner I'm Your Father (by Tiznow).

A full sister to multiple Grade 2 winner Withalprobability (dam of multiple Grade 3 winner With Ability, by A. P. Indy, and second dam of Grade 1 winner Summer Colony) and a half sister to stakes winner Kadrmas (by Gulch), Crystal Shard is also a half sister to Bradamante (by Roberto), dam of Japanese champion 3-year-old filly Still in Love (by Sunday Silence), and to Color of Gold (by Seeking the Gold), dam of 2007 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) winner Robe Collette (by Cozzene). Crystal Shard and her siblings are out of Grade 3 winner Sulemeif, a half sister to three stakes winners including 1989 Oak Leaf Stakes winner One of a Klein (by Danzig), and the genetic package that produced Gemologist is tied

together by 5x5x4 inbreeding to Northern Dancer, the sire of Sulemeif and also the sire of Tiznow's third-generation ancestors Lyphard and Nice Dancer.

For a tall, big-framed horse standing close to 17 hands, Gemologist proved surprisingly handy and athletic as a 2-year-old. Undefeated in three starts as a juvenile, he concluded that season by winning the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (G2) with a determined stretch drive. At 3, he stretched his unbeaten skein to five with an impressive one-mile allowance win at Gulfstream Park and a game win by a neck in the Resorts World Casino New York City Wood Memorial (G1). Unfortunately, he bruised a foot while running unplaced in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) and did not seem sharp when brought out after three months on the shelf for the Haskell Invitational Handicap (G1), finishing sixth. An injury suffered while in training soon afterward brought his career to a close with five wins from seven starts and earnings of \$794,855.

Gemologist got off to a good start at stud with his first crop, foals of 2014, with Yellow Agate (Lemon Sorbet, by Lemon Drop Kid) winning the 2016 Frizette Stakes (G1) and Theory (Gem Sleuth, by Officer) win-

ning the Futurity Stakes (G3). Their victories helped him finish 2016 at fifth on the national first-crop sire list. Both his stars fell prey to early injuries, however, and although two more stakes winners have come from that crop, Gemologist suffered the all-too-common slump experienced by stallions when crops sired in “bubble years” come to the track and had only one other stakes winner through 2018. In response to the falloff, Gemologist ended up moving from WinStar Farm to Acadiana Equine@Copper Crowne, where he currently stands.



Kentucky's loss may be Louisiana's gain, as Gemologist has doubled his previous lifetime production of stakes winners within the last three months and has the prospect of a strong crop reaching the track in 2020, sired from mates attracted to his 2017 book by the performances of Yellow Agate and Theory. The stallion completed his fourth season of shuttling to Chile in 2018 and recently had a Group 1 winner from his first Chilean-sired crop when his La Buena Vida (La Especial, by Mizzen Mast) won the Premio Mil Guineas—Maria Luisa Solari F. on August 31. In the United States, the star of the 2019 season has been 2019 Monmouth Oaks (G3) winner Horologist (Cinderella Time, by Stephen Got Even), who followed up her defeat of 2018 champion 2-year-old filly Jaywalk with a third-place finish in the Cotillion Stakes (G1).

Four of Gemologist's ten stakes winners thus far are from mares sired by Seattle Slew-line sires, and three more have Seattle Slew in other positions in the first four generations of their dams' pedigrees. Storm Bird is another name that appears with above-average fre-

quency in the names of Gemologist's stakes winners, appearing through either Storm Cat or Summer Squall in four stakes winners as well as two Group stakes-placed runners in Chile. Provided that sound, well-balanced mares are chosen who do not have Mr. Prospector closer than the third generation of their own pedigrees, Gemologist's results thus far do not indicate any need to avoid Mr. Prospector blood in his mates.

Tiznow and his sons have generally been horses who boasted a high cruising speed as their primary asset, and like many horses of this type, have benefited from being mated to mares with more power in their makeups, particularly through the hindquarters. In return, Gemologist offers the opportunity to put some more leg, stretch, and scope into the foals of a strongly built mare, along with good bone and substance. He has already shown the ability to come up with high-class juveniles, and with a good chance of one or more “name” runners emerging from the 109 live foals reported in his 2018 crop, he may just be a diamond in the rough at his 2019 fee of \$4,500.

# UP TO THE CHALLENGE

If you don't cross the line once in a while you will never know where you are or where you are going.

Ask Dr. Arian Haxhillari about the fear and trembling of stepping across forbidden boundaries. For the young teenager, it happened one afternoon after soccer practice in northern Albania.

The field for Haxhillari's high school team was adjacent to a pre-

mier horse farm. Attracted and curious, Haxhillari and a few teammates wandered past the “No Trespassing” signs and over to the fence line for a closer look. “The horses were beautiful,” Haxhillari recalls. “They were spectacular looking athletes and I wanted to pet them.”

Look but don’t touch. Within minutes a group of armed security personnel came on the scene and escorted Haxhillari and his friends off the premises.

It turned out that the property was a thoroughbred stud farm for a high ranking Communist official. The warning to the young Haxhillari was brief but crystal clear. Don’t come back.

Obeying orders and staying between the lines of social norms is not a Haxhillari character trait. Decades and a trans-atlantic continent later he is standing tall in the winner’s circle at Evangeline Downs after his chestnut mare Galaxy Thirty Six won the \$50,000 Louisiana Legends Distaff Starter Stakes.

“That night was one of the most

incredible feelings I can remember,” Haxhillari explains. “I had entered other horses in stakes races before but this one, unlike some of the others had a good chance. In this horse business you can never place your hopes too high.

“Once she turned for home and opened up an overwhelming burst of emotions came over me. It was the first visit to the track for a group of my friends and they were all yelling and screaming.”

Galaxy Thirty Six is Haxhillari’s first stakes winner as an owner.

His introduction and involvement in horse racing is a classic example of the road less traveled. It is a story of determination and compassion.

As a doctor in Albania with a specialty in Family Medicine, he came to the United States at the age of 27. Unable to speak English, he enrolled in a private, intensive class for English learners in Houston, Texas. “It was either that or flip burgers,” Haxhillari jokes about his decision to go for the long haul.

Culture shock.

Haxhillari recalls his first impression of life in America. “The people here were so welcoming and supportive,” he remembers of his arrival. “Unlike in my home country it was obvious that I was in an open society where everything was up for grabs. The United States gives a person an opportunity to succeed if you are willing to face up to challenging work and effort.”

Once eligible to practice in the United States--Dr. Haxhillari made steady progress in his profession.

State and local governments do not seem to have enough interest in the sport. Horse racing has a huge impact on people's lives and the economy.

Eventually elevated to the position of Chief Hospitalist at St. Patrick's Hospital in Lake Charles where he is the current lead over ten other doctors, the 51-year-old Haxhillari took notice of the number of patients he was treating that were directly involved in the horse business.

"Much of the time I was seeing trainers, jockeys and exercise riders from Delta Downs with all sorts of problems and injuries," Haxhillari remembers. "One person in particular was an ex-jockey that was paralyzed. A mutual interest and friendship developed and he invited me to his home which was a trailer park. Those conversations opened up a new network of friends and contacts on the race track."

The usual pattern developed from there. Everyone advised Haxhillari that the quickest and best way to gain introduction to the game would be to claim horses. The advice, well meant, did not take root. "I didn't want somebody else's horse. I want a horse that is mine."

Haxhillari went to his first horse sale at Evangeline in 2009 and purchased a few 2-year-olds in training. "They did not turn out that good but I got my feet wet."

Once involved as an owner Haxhillari kept knowledgeable and up to date by reading and studying the rules and regulations of horse racing. "I believe that this sport

needs overall unification. The different regulations from state to state regarding medications create lines that are unclear," Haxhillari says. "There is a gray area and that has the potential of eroding the confidence of the fans and public. The other factor is that state and local governments do not seem to have enough interest in the sport. Horse racing has a huge impact on people's lives and the economy."

As a practicing doctor at a hospital, Haxhillari is qualified and entitled to his opinion on a larger issue. "The healthcare of all the people on the backstretch and their financial security is not clear," Haxhillari states with emphasis. "What happens to them when they get sick, injured or their racing career is

over? It is devastating to me that they have so few options. There has to be a safe and secure environment for these people as exists in other industries. And it should not be the burden of private donations or just the Jockey Guild."

Married for 24 years to his wife Pranvere (which is the Albanian word for Spring), the couple has one 5-year-old daughter named Gianna. Attendance at the race track however is usually limited to Haxhillari. "My wife is a lover of animals but doesn't have much interest in horse racing. She doesn't like the competing spirit where people respond as either winners or losers. She feels bad when horses lose."

From the day that the young boy ignored those "No Trespassing" in Albania to his present life in the United States, Haxhillari's passion has not been extinguished. "For me the charm and beauty of horse racing is seeing the animals as athletes," he explains. "Humans bring effort and intelligence to their athletic attempts but the horse is a pure bred athlete from birth. The horse cannot become anything else. It is bred to run. There is an elegance to the sport of horse racing. You see a young child and his or her future is an unknown. But you see a young horse and the only potential is to become an athlete."

# MAKING THE GRADE

Education is a priceless asset that adds to the quality of life. The cost of that education can place a heavy financial burden upon students and their families. A scholarship can help to alleviate the financial crunch that so many endure. The generosity of one thoroughbred farm owner has created a scholarship to benefit college-bound students from Louisiana racing families



in order to help them reach their educational goals.

Val Murrell, the owner of Clear Creek Stud in Folsom, saw a need for a scholarship that would benefit the young men and women whose families are part of the Louisiana racing and breeding community. Murrell felt the need to give back to the families in an industry that has served him well.

those individuals in the Louisiana Thoroughbred industry who have worked so hard to support their families,” said Murrell. “The backstretch and farm workers, trainers, and all the hard-working horsemen who have a passion for the horse and the business. Many of them do not have the resources available to send their children to college so we would like to make the scholarship an annual award. We hope that this will spur others in the industry to make scholarships available to those who need it the most.”

Murrell engaged the help of the Louisiana Horsemen’s Benevolent and Protective Association and Executive Director Ed Fenasci to discover a worthy recipient for the \$5,000 scholarship.

The criteria for selection was determined by Fenasci and Murrell after a diligent search turned up several outstanding candidates.

“We put the word out on the backstretch and to the farms in order to let everyone know that we had the scholarship available,” said Fenasci. “We narrowed it down to five very qualified individuals and reviewed academic careers, GPA, test scores, integrity, references, and extracurricular activities. The candidates were all very deserving but there was one standout and that was Peyton Wilson. His level of excellence in all areas exceeded our criteria.”

Peyton, the son of trainer Shane Wilson and his wife Rebecca, grew up on the backstretch and learned

how to handle horses, muck a stall, and manage a racing stable. He even worked as part of the maintenance crew at Evangeline Downs to save money for college. This fall Peyton hung up his tack and weed eater to enroll as a freshman in the honors program at Louisiana State University majoring in mechanical engineering.

“We are thrilled and grateful that Peyton received this generous scholarship,” said Shane. “He has always wanted to be an engineer ever since he was a little boy. This is a natural for him. He has really made us proud. Hopefully he will

come back to the racing industry one day with an important engineering design.”

Peyton, a graduate of St. Thomas Moore High School in Lafayette, was a state champion football player and enjoyed fishing with friends, but always managed to prioritize studying before everything else.

“He displayed a maturity and focus that was amazing for his age,” said Shane. “Good grades and studying were the first and foremost thing on his mind. He never played video games or partied with his friends. Peyton’s mind was always on the books and it paid off. We feel very blessed and gracious for everything he has received.”

The Wilsons have deep roots in the Louisiana horse racing industry. Shane has been a trainer since 1998 and normally keeps around forty to fifty horses in training throughout the year. He races primarily on the Louisiana circuit with occasional trips to Texas. Rebecca, a former assistant trainer for James O’Brien, and their younger son Conner, 15, ride and show hunter jumpers and dressage on their retired off-track Thoroughbreds.

In addition to Peyton’s scholastic achievements a streak of racing luck with a former \$10,000 claimer has rewarded the Wilson’s with an amazing racehorse who just keeps improving. Mocito Rojo scored his second Grade 3 win and fifth victory in a row when he won the 1 1/8-mile \$250,000 Lukas Classic Stakes (G3) at Churchill Downs on

September 28. The Lukas Classic has been a steppingstone for the Breeders’ Cup in previous years.

“The Breeders’ Cup is a big step, so we will have to work our way up that direction,” said Shane. “This horse has given us and his owner Wayne Davis the ride of our lives. I’ve never had a horse this good. Believe it or not, five stakes wins in a row, two graded, and he’s never been the favorite to win. We have been so blessed to have this horse. He’s truly a game changer for us. He has so much heart and gives his all every time. We compare him to Peyton; they both have so much talent, focus, and perseverance.”

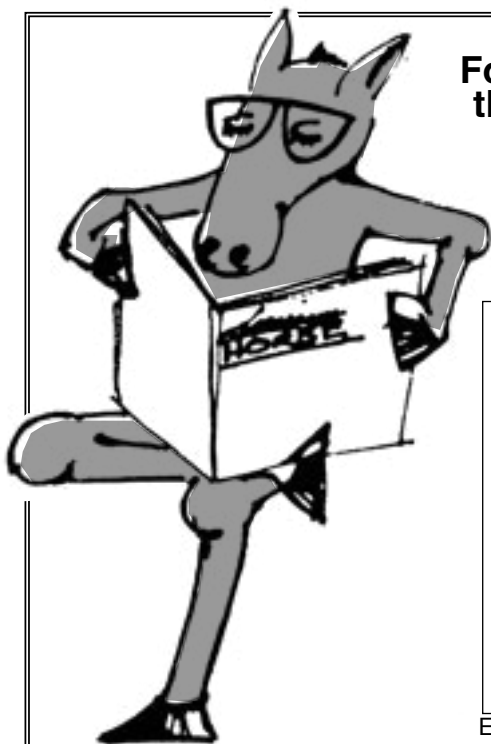
Shane claimed Mocito Rojo for \$10,000 in a maiden claiming race at Delta Downs. The five-year-old son of Mutadda out of the Orientate mare Blushing Royale has compiled a 17-3-1 record in 25 starts for a bankroll of \$797,000. He scored his first Grade 3 victory on April 28 in the Steve Sexton Mile Stakes (G3) at Lone Star Park. After his victory under the twin spires Shane plans to send Mocito Rojo back to race in Louisiana over the fall and winter.

“The trip to Kentucky was incredible, but it’s time to go home,” Shane said. “There is plenty of racing for Mocito Rojo in

Louisiana. We also want to be close to home for our boys, and hope for Peyton’s visits on the weekends.”

Shane attributes many things to Peyton’s academic success, but primarily a lot of family support, his natural talents, and desire to excel.

“Peyton always studied on his own, we never had to tell him to hit the books,” Shane reflected. “He has always known what he wanted to do in life. When people ask us how we got him to study the answer is always the same—we provided a lot of hugs, support, and positive encouragement. Just like his brother Conner, he’s a fantastic kid. They make us proud.”

### REPRODUCTIVE VETERINARY SERVICES CAN ASSIST MARES AND STALLIONS

**B**reeding horses is often challenging; it sometimes takes a dedicated team of mare or stallion managers and reproductive veterinarians to maximize pregnancy rates. Many farm veterinarians do an excellent job, sometimes assisted by reproductive specialists at equine hospitals or universities when working with a problem mare or stallion.

Maria Schnobrich DMD, DACP (boarded theriogenologist at the LeBlanc Center for Reproduction, Rood and Riddle) works with her repro group at Rood and Riddle and several universities looking at ways to improve fertility.

#### **MAKE SURE THE MARE IS SUITABLE FOR BREEDING**

Thoroughbred mares entering a breeding shed are often required to have a “suitable for mating” examination by a veterinarian. “This will determine whether a mare’s reproductive tract is healthy, and if the mare is ready for breeding (appropriate stage of estrous cycle) and will tolerate a stallion breeding by natural cover. We use a combination of physical examination, trans-rectal palpation and ultrasound of the reproductive tract and vaginoscopy, as well as obtaining a clean endometrial culture (free of bacterial growth) and normal endometrial cytology, prior to breeding. We check for any abnormalities that could reduce likelihood of a successful

mating or might be potentially harmful to the stallion,” says Schnobrich.

“Abnormalities would include evidence of sexually transmissible diseases (coital exanthema or EHV-3), large amounts of fluid in the uterus, evidence of infection or urine pooling, or conformational abnormalities that could be a problem during mating. We also obtain a culture and cytology before breeding, to ensure there is no evidence of clinical infection or excessive inflammation,” says Schnobrich.

Any problems need to be dealt with and resolved before the mare is bred. “We may not have 100% evidence that there are no issues, but at this point in time these are the most routine, thorough, and practical things we can do. Sending a mare that is not suitable uses up valuable covers for a stallion and (in the case of transmissible diseases) may pose risk for the breeding population.”

It is important to have mares in good body condition—not overly fat or thin. Too fat is worse than being underweight. Mares that are somewhat thin but gaining weight are more likely to cycle properly and become pregnant. “It is well known in other domestic species like sheep, that if they are ‘flushed’—on an increasing plane of nutrition before breeding—they are more fertile and have higher pregnancy rates. We try to have mares in proper body condition and gaining weight going into

January,” she says.

Being current on appropriate vaccinations is also important, following the AAEP guidelines for pregnant mares. “In the fall it may also be helpful to vaccinate with the new equine vaccine for Leptospirosis pomona to help prevent pregnancy loss. As far as we know, there have been no abortions reported from leptospirosis in mares that have been vaccinated.” Vaccinations against equine herpes virus (EHV-1) should be administered at 3, 5, 7, and 9 months of gestation to aid in prevention of equine abortion.

“We also try to address any systemic health issues, lameness, chronic pain, etc. Mares should be screened for overall health, and checked for equine endocrine disorders such as equine metabolic syndrome (EMS) or Pituitary Pars Intermedia Dysfunction (PPID or Cushings) sometime in the fall/winter before breeding season. Make sure any pathology is well regulated for at least 60 days coming into breeding season,” she says.

At the end of breeding season it is just as important to make sure mares are in good reproductive health if they are not pregnant. “Any reproductive surgeries that need to be done should be taken care of before next breeding season. These might include cervical repairs, perineal body reconstruction (after foaling injuries), and urethral extensions to prevent urine pooling. Many chronically

infected mares continually collect urine in the uterus, and are not diagnosed or addressed,” says Schnobrich.

“You also want a clean endometrial culture and cytology. It is very detrimental to the mare’s reproductive tract to go through the whole winter with an infection. It is imperative to clear up any infection to protect and optimize uterine health for the next year.”

Uterine cysts and oviduct pathology are usually addressed in early January to allow time for resolution of any inflammation caused by these procedures, but not so far away from breeding that a mare might develop new cysts or reocclude an oviduct. “New advances in treatment for oviduct pathologies include hysteroscopic flushing or application of prostaglandins on the oviduct or its opening into the uterus. If we suspect a plugged oviduct (which occurs in a small subset of mares) we may apply prostaglandins to the oviduct or flush it,” she says.

Because the Thoroughbred breeding season starts early, it is also important to make sure mares are under lights at the appropriate time and that lighting is adequate so mares can go through the transition from anestrus to cycling early. Manipulation of breeding season can be accomplished by providing 14 to 16 hours of light daily, starting at least 8 to 10 weeks prior to the breeding season. This regimen is typically begun on December 1st.

### **SPECIALIZED REPRODUCTIVE FACILITIES**

There are times a certain mare (or stallion) might be sent to a spe-

cialist or referral facility where specific problems could be more fully evaluated and addressed. Several referral clinics/hospitals have specialists who do this. Your veterinarian may be able to do what is needed, or may want to work with a specialist to get some answers or further treatment options. Sometimes it takes a team effort.

“We do breeding soundness exams and assist equine reproduction with traditional and routine breeding work, but if a mare or stallion needs more advanced assistance we can do some of these procedures. We also have horses referred to us for more advanced diagnostics,” Schnobrich says.

“Usually we get these at the end of breeding season when a mare has not become pregnant, and the resident veterinarian has run out of options. Probably the most helpful thing we can do is a hysteroscopic exam where we look into the uterus. We often do this with mares that have had persistent infections. We generally find they have adhesions, foreign bodies or scarring in the uterus. In my opinion this type of exam is a very important tool because there are mares that are chronically ‘dirty’ yet you can’t determine why. A mare owner might spend thousands of dollars trying to figure out and resolve the infection and never get her cleared up,” says Schnobrich.

Some problems won’t show up with ultrasound. “When we go in with the scope we might find there is serious scarring, that cannot be detected by ultrasound. We’ve seen mares with uterine horns closed off, or huge scars or adhesions that would prevent pregnancy from

developing normally, but you wouldn’t know it from any other test except the hysteroscopic exam. This exam and a biopsy are very helpful tools for the owner to have realistic expectations about the mare, and we could potentially diagnose something that was previously undiagnosed,” she says.

Some of these problems can be addressed and resolved, and some might not be resolvable. “Either way, we need to know. With some mares, owners and veterinarians have tried for a number of years to get them in foal, unsuccessfully, and then we check them and find the uterus is too scarred to carry a pregnancy. Not knowing that condition, you could waste a lot of money trying to get them pregnant.”

### **THE STALLION**

One thing we can do to try to optimize pregnancy rates is look at a stallion’s previous fertility and what percentage of his mares became pregnant. “If you ask the stud farm about how a certain stallion has done in the past, it is important to ask two questions,” says Schnobrich.

“One is his per-cycle pregnancy rate (settling a mare on her first cycle) the previous year, and this is the most important question. The per-cycle rate should be above 60% and is a more sensitive indication of a stallion’s fertility. Per-cycle pregnancy rate measures how efficient a stallion is at establishing a pregnancy. The other question is his end-of-season pregnancy rate; of the mares bred, how many did he get pregnant that season,” says Schnobrich.

According to Stephanie Walbornn, DVM, DACT (theriogenologist at Rood and Riddle) a stallion can have a very low per-cycle pregnancy rate, but still have a high end-of-season pregnancy rate, given enough time to rebreed the mares. "This is because the seasonal pregnancy rate does not take into account how many times the same mare is bred, over consecutive cycles. Thus seasonal pregnancy rate can be an overestimation of the true number of pregnancies a stallion can obtain. Increasing the number of times a stallion breeds the same mare (over several cycles) increases the amount of physical work for that stallion and costs for both the stallion and mare owners. Ideally, one cover per mare would result in a pregnancy," says Walbornn.

In the Thoroughbred industry it is important to have foals born early, so we want mares bred and settled as soon as possible. "You don't want to breed to a stallion that takes multiple tries. If he is batting 40% or lower per cycle, there may be additional management techniques needed, to try to improve those percentages," she says.

"With natural cover we can perform reinforced breeding. Some studies have shown that this can help stallions who have low per-cycle pregnancy rates. After he covers a mare, the dismount sample is taken, extended, and inseminated into the mare's uterus. With some stallions, this technique is beneficial," Walbornn says.

Schnobrich says most stud farms utilize management procedures to help these stallions, such as limiting book size, limiting covers to just two per day--spread very far apart--and reinforcement breeding. It is important for mare owners or managers to ask about these things and find out whether this is being done. "Often your own veterinarian can be there at the breeding to do the reinforcement breeding, or the stud farm may provide a veterinarian, or they may be able to do it themselves, but this is something to think about, to optimize the mare's chances to settle to that breeding," says Schnobrich.

Walbornn says some stallions may need an increased number of covers per day to improve their pregnancy rate. "These stallions are known as 'accumulators'. They

accumulate sperm within their accessory sex glands (ampullae) which can prevent the ejaculated sperm from reaching the urethra and being deposited into the mare's uterus. If only a small quantity of abnormal stagnant sperm is being deposited into their uterus, mares may not become pregnant," she says.

"Management techniques for these stallions include increasing the number of covers per day, administering ecboic agents such as oxytocin or prostaglandin F2 alpha prior to breeding, or transrectal massage of the ampullae prior to breeding. Regardless of the reason for low per-cycle or seasonal pregnancy rate, it is important to try to maximize chances of pregnancy by optimizing fertility in both the stallion and mare," says Walbornn.

"In general, horses are very fertile, and when using live cover we assume that for each mating there should be about a 65 to 70% chance the mare will conceive," says Schnobrich.

Going post-ward as the odds-on favorite was nothing new for the five-year-old gelded son of Into Mischief. The Steve Asmussen trainee had been made the betting favorite in his previous three starts.

With jockey Richard Eramia in the irons, it took a while for Theoryintopractice to settle into stride. "He was really rank the first quarter of a mile" explained Eramia. "Around the 5/8ths pole he relaxed really good and we went on from there." Starting from the inside #2 post, Theoryintopractice stayed glued to the rail behind a quartet of front speed. Approaching the home-stretch Theoryintopractice was loaded with run but had

nowhere to go and a wall of horses still spread out in front of him. Eramia slipped his mount out into the three path for an opening, but that hole disappeared fast. With few other options the pair swung widest of all and began an attack on In the Navy who at this stage of the race had a two-length advantage with a quarter of a mile left to race.

Not to worry. “I thought we had it all the time” said Eramia “He likes to wait on other horses and doesn’t like to win by big margins. This is a really good Louisiana-bred.” Theoryintopractice engaged In The Navy to his inside and slugged it out to the wire. Final

time for the 1-1/6 mile on the firm turf was a respectable 1:40.87.

The nerve wrecking performance was rewarding for the winning owner Courtney Barousse who took the long six hour drive up from New Orleans to see his charge perform. “I love that the fractions were so quick up front,” Barousse, who currently has eight horses in training, said. “I was hoping that it would set up for us that way. Richard (Eramia) rode a hell of a race and Steve (Asmussen) did a great job of getting him ready.”

Under Colby Hernandez, Is Too was allowed to cruise on the lead through soft internal fractions. Dueling for the lead is problematic and Is Too finally shook loose of long shot Bella Cajun after running a leisurely six furlongs in 1:13.18. A challenge presented itself inside the final furlong as Bermuda Star was making a sustained rally from the rear of the pack. “Between the 1/16th pole and the wire my filly heard (Bermuda Star) coming and she gave me a little extra to make sure she wouldn’t go by us” explained Hernandez. All out to the wire, Is Too’s margin of victory was a nail biting half length. Final time for the 1-1/16 mile on the turf was 1:42.21.

Presenting the trophy to the winning connections was breeder Jay Adcock, who bred and raised Is Too in partnership with Jim and Natalie Montgomery. “This filly (Is Too) looked the part from the beginning,” Adcock remembers. “The mare (Tensas Salt) has never

Fans and industry insiders were caught doing a double take after the completion of the \$50,000 Louisiana Cup Sprint Stakes. Rodney Verret's Laughingsaintsong was a 10-1 upset winner and did so by demolishing the field by 5 ½ lengths. It was not a push over. The field included 2018 Louisiana-bred Horse of the Year, Monte Man.

After a sharp break Laughingsaintsong by Songandaprayer out of the Vindication mare Laughing Saint was eased back by jockey Colby Hernandez through the opening stages of the race. "He broke sharp and put us where we needed to be" explained Hernandez. "We had a great outside trip. Around the 5/16th pole I could feel that I had a ton of horse. When I called on him, he exploded for me."

Nothing beats experience. Being aboard Laughingsaintsong for his previous race, Hernandez knew what kind of turn of foot his charge possessed. Laughingsaintsong used that turn of foot and garnered the lead mid-way into the turn and dared his competition to come catch him. Rapid early fractions was the story line for the Louisiana Cup Sprint. Kept to the task approaching the wire, Laughingsaintsong came home in the final time of 1:10.07.

State Treasurer and Double Barrel Man chased home the winner, finishing second and third respectively.

Wiping sweat beads from his forehead, winning

trainer Allen Landry reflected on the win. "We worried about the heat a little bit with him, but he adapted to it today. Last year he had heat problems. We tried to do a few things to help him and he's doing a lot better dealing with it this summer."

It was a long time between drinks for World War IV Racing's seven-year-old mare Diamond Cutter. Winless in over a year, Diamond Cutter delivered the highest mutuel payoff on Louisiana Cup Day (\$23.00), while securing her second black type victory in the \$50,000 Louisiana Cup Filly and Mare Sprint. The popular 29-year-old rising star jockey Joel Dominguez from Durango, Mexico navigated the victory for trainer Dwight Viator.

Diamond Cutter broke from the far outside post and immediately raced into contention. "I gave her a nice

brisk warm up” explained Dominquez. “I wanted to have her ready for the break and put her up close. She put me right where I wanted her.” The duo raced a few lengths back of a rapid opening quarter mile that was clocked in 22.61. Still in the clear on the outside, Diamond Cutter began to pick off horses with what many may have thought a pre-mature move. Finding the lead shortly before entering the homestretch, the others found themselves in chase mode. Tensas Thought would rally for second, 3 ¼ lengths behind the winner.

Such a commanding victory would lead one to think there’s plenty of racing left for Diamond Cutter but Viator outlined her future plans. “You can look at her chart and see that she is a really consistent mare,” Viator explained. “Every time she runs, she gives it her all to hit the board. She is very sound but at seven years old it is time for her to produce some babies. She’ll be bred next year.”

A home-bred for Warren McFatter and John Christmann’s World War IV Racing, the bay mare Diamond Cutter is by Salute the Sarge out of Sparkling Diamond, by Finest Hour.

Final time for the six furlong sprint was 1:10.96.

The Louisiana Cup stakes day card was filled with many competitive fields and some of the best Louisiana bred currently in training. Ronnie Ward’s two-year-old-gelding Scotty Boy turned in one of the most impressive eye-catching performances on the day.

The six-furlong \$50,000 Louisiana Cup Juvenile Sprint saw Scotty Boy taking on seven rivals, including heavy odds on favorite Pickens. Doing everything the right way, Scotty Boy broke to the lead and attended an early moderate pace from the outside. The bay gelding by Fast Anna was reined back and content to sit second behind the heavy favorite. Under strong handling from jockey Alexander Castillo, the pair sat off the hip of the favorite for the first half mile. The duel around the far turn was short lived. Given his cue to commence his challenge entering the far turn it was just a matter of

strides before Scotty Boy seized the lead. Kept in reserve while under a hand ride turning into the home-stretch, Scotty Boy was given a few taps of the whip and won by 8 ½ widening lengths, in the final time of 1:11.46.

“Before Louisiana Downs began their two-year old races, we took him down to Evangeline Downs and had to start him off there” conditioner Ward said of Scotty Boy’s preparation. “We put him in the D.S. Shine Futurity and he had a bad trip, but he’s been working great ever since, and he loves to train over this (Louisiana Downs) surface. He is just a really easy going horse around the barn. He came into this race real sharp and we are really proud of him. He makes my job easy.”

Winning breeders Time Will Tell, which consist of retired physician Dr. Fred Willis, who has been involved in the sport since the 1970’s and his partner--Lafayette attorney Emile Joseph bred the winner from their Teton Forest mare Golden Dina.

Scotty Boy is a gelded son of Fast Anna who stands at Three Chimney Farms in Kentucky.

What a difference a day makes. When last seen under silks, Cheryl and Dennis Dendy’s First U Make Aroux was dominating a \$12,000 maiden claiming race by over 12 lengths. Talk about moving up in class. In her next outing the daughter of Due Date would capture the \$50,000 Louisiana Cup Juvenile Fillies. Conditioned by Justin Jeansonne and ridden to victory by Hall of Fame jockey Edgar Prado, First U Make Aroux showed a ton of upside potential in the six-furlong stakes.

“We had a beautiful trip” explained Prado. “I saw a couple of horses wanted the lead, so we sat right behind the speed. She was comfortable all the way while tucked in on the rail. When I brought her to the outside turning for home she immediately took off and found another gear. She gave me a lot of confidence the entire trip.”

From her mid-pack position, First U Make Aroux

decided she wanted the lead and from there encountered no resistance from post time favorite Sarah’s Passion, who would settle for second ahead of Joe G’s Payback. The final time for the six panels was 1:12.40.

Building blocks. A delighted Jeansonne explained the reasoning for starting First U Make Aroux off for a price tag. “We try to put our horses where they need to be to build their confidence up and go from there. We were hoping nobody would claim her and, lucky for us, it worked out.”

Missing the winner’s circle celebration were New Orleans owners Cheryl and Dennis Dendy, who were vacationing at Saratoga Springs in New York.

What’s in a name? Breeder Lora Pitre names all of her horses from food or cooking terms. The promising 2-year-old filly First U Make Aroux is from the Indian Charlie mare Chef Bertie.

# HEAVY ON

Allan Savoie really would rather talk about his best horse, Heavy On Themister, than the rest of his Rebecca Farm breeding operation.

That's because "Mister" won or placed in multiple stakes and earned \$725,350 in 68 starts during eight years racing in Louisiana. He was a regular participant in the various state-bred stakes championship days at Fair Grounds, Delta Downs, Louisiana Downs and the Fair Grounds.

In 2012 he won the Evangeline Mile and Louisiana Champions Day Classic, following up in 2013

with the Louisiana Premier Night Championship at Delta. He was ridden by Rosie Napravnik in the latter two victories. For a time he held the six-furlong track record at Evangeline.

But these days, the 11-year-old gelding has entered a second career, becoming the poster horse for the fledgling Louisiana division of the New Vocations Racehorse Adoption Program. Both Savoie and the horse seem happy about it.

Rebecca Farm and T.J. Dickey bred, owned and raced Mister, then sold him privately when he was 6, Savoie said. As the horse aged, he

changed hands, and eventually dropped down the claiming ladder. When he got down to the \$4,000-level in July 2018 at Evangeline, Savoie took action.

"Heavy On Themister made Rebecca Farm from the standpoint of racing and the breeder's awards. He carried the farm and was responsible for a lot of broodmares. He bought a lot of broodmares," Savoie said.

"When they dropped him in a low claiming race I asked Terry Gabriel to get him claimed and we would just retire him. I figured he had done enough on the track and

earned enough for us and made plenty enough money in breeder's awards, that I didn't want him to end up ... you know."

New Vocations established a Louisiana division in February. About a dozen Thoroughbreds have come to Equi-best Equestrian Center in Covington to be retrained for second careers under the direction of owner and trainer Lynn Quast.

Jessalyn Putt, who handles the foaling of Rebecca Farms mares in Louisiana, set up the donation of Mister to New Vocations.

When Savoie came to see how Mister was doing, he was stunned

by the change in the former racehorse. Mister was cantankerous at the racetrack, but now he allowed children attending riding camps to lead, graze, groom and generally shower him with attention.

"When we raced him he was a pretty tough cookie. You couldn't use a lead horse with him. They had to saddle him while he was walking. He wouldn't let you saddle him. He was mean," Savoie recalled.

Quast said Mister's reputation preceded him, but he has been well-behaved. "He was never like the stories I heard." One experienced 12-year-old has ridden him.

Although New Vocations posted a video of Mister serenely trotting around an arena, Quast said he has shown a clear preference for trail riding.

"He is the happiest outdoors on the trail or in a field. In the arena, indoors, that's really not his thing. He likes to be out and about," she said. "He'll go through water, ditches. Nothing phases him out on the trail. He's a solid citizen, not a spook in the world."

Mister retired sound and has clean legs. Quast said he needs a chiropractic adjustment about once a month and some massage.

"We're so happy to be able to do

this for these horses,” Quast said. “It gives them a second chance. It’s amazing, just in a short period of time, how these guys change. It’s a wonderful thing that we’re being able to do.”

Rebecca Farm itself is more of a business entity than a farm, although Savoie is in the process of setting up a new place on 10 acres in the Gonzales area, where he also lives. He keeps three or four mares in Kentucky and about the same number in Louisiana.

Savoie grew up in Belle Rose, where it seemed every kid had a horse. “I always had a riding horse, always loved horses. I grew up on a sugarcane plantation. We always had horses in the backyard.”

He also followed horse racing. “Ruffian was my favorite horse growing up,” he said. As an adult, he went into the construction industry. A family friend got Savoie into breeding with a \$5,000 in-foal mare from a Keeneland sale. He sold the foal for a good price and bought another mare.

“You start out doing it personally, and then you realize that there’s some revenue coming in and you need to form a little company, form an LLC,” Savoie said. Rebecca Farm is named after his daughter, as is a 3-year-old filly by Yes It True he’s currently running, Rebecca’s Truth.

The breeding operation grew when Savoie became involved with the Lion Tamer syndicate. Lion Tamer ran from age 2 to 5, winning the Grade 1 Cigar Mile and placing

third in the Breeders’ Cup Sprint while earning just over \$1 million. The stallion stood at Clear Creek Stud from 2007 to 2016. Savoie said Lion Tamer’s proven ability at sprint and mile distances made the son of Will’s Way ideal for Louisiana.

Rebecca Farm eventually reached 18 broodmares in Kentucky and Folsom. Heavy On Themister is a son of Lion Tamer out of Savoie’s mare Twinwinwin, by Twining. Mister’s full brother is the stakes-winning gelding Win Lion Win, still running at age 8 for Farm D’Allie Racing Stable. With 47 starts Win Lion Win has earned just over \$400,000.

This year Win Lion Win has won the Costa Rising Stakes at Fair Grounds and placed second in both the Louisiana Legends Sprint at

Evangeline and the Mystic Lake Turf Sprint at Canterbury Park in Minnesota. He placed second in the Costa Rising in 2015.

Unfortunately Twinwinwin died of laminitis after losing her fifth foal.

The new Rebecca Farm currently is home to three mares and four weanlings. The weanlings are headed to the January Keeneland sale, while two of the mares are in foal to Custom for Carlos and the third to Sharp Azteca. “I feed horses every morning and every afternoon,” Savoie said.

In talking about his horses, Savoie repeatedly calls them “hard-knocking.” He notes that Lion Tamer raced through age five and made

20 starts, more than many Grade 1 winners today. Twinwinwin won some \$220,000 in allowance company. Both Heavy On Themister and Win Lion Win are remarkably durable stakes winners.

In addition to breeding for durability, Savoie preaches patience. “Neither one of them ran as a 2-year-old and both of them ran as 3-year-olds. When you take your time with them it makes a big difference.”

Rebecca’s Truth didn’t start at 2, and the 2-year-old filly by Jack Milton he has in training will either start at the upcoming Fair Grounds meeting or wait until she turns 3.

“Really, the ones that last the longest are the ones that start either late late [as a] 2-yr-old, or early as a 3 year-old.”

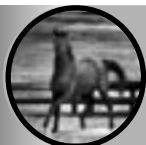

olds sell for seven figures in 2019, led by a \$1,800,000 filly at the Fasig-Tipton Timonium sale in May – breaking a record for the highest-priced horse ever sold publicly in Maryland. He also sired the \$1,300,000 sale topper at OBS April and \$900,000 sale topper at OBS June this year, giving him an industry-high four 2-year-old sale toppers in the last two years.

Into Mischief's impact is also being felt as a sire of sires. Goldencents, Into Mischief's first son to enter stud, is the No. 1 Second Crop Sire in North America in 2019. His newest son to stud, Maximus Mischief, was recently announced to be standing alongside Into Mischief and Goldencents at Spendthrift for an introductory fee of \$7,500 S&N in 2020.

**Champion, Dixie Poker Ace, Humanely Euthanized at 32**

Two time Accredited Louisiana Bred Champion Dixie Poker Ace was humanely euthanized on Monday, September 16 at Lora Pitre's Peach Lane Farms in Opelousas. He was 32.

The bay gelded son of Patriotically, out of the Poker mare Hot Stripper, started 86 times in a race career that ran from ages two to nine with a record of 27-17-15. At one time, Dixie Poker Ace was the leading Louisiana Bred money earner. His lifetime earnings of \$850,126 continue to keep him among the top all-time Louisiana bred runners, currently ranking him 14th.

He won a remarkable 18 stakes races including three consecutive



runnings of the Louisiana Champions Day Turf Stakes (1991-93) and placed in an additional 21 stakes including a third place finish in the 1994 G3 Ark-La-Tex Handicap. The same year, he set a new course record at Fair Grounds running the approximate 1 1/16 miles in 1:42.00. In 2001, Fair Grounds initiated the Dixie Poker Ace Handicap in his honor.

In 1991 and 1992, he was voted Accredited Louisiana Bred Champion 4 Year Old & Upwards Male by the membership of the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association.

By Patriotically, a half brother to multiple graded placed stakes winner Northerly, Dixie Poker Ace was bred in Louisiana by venerable horseman, the late John Franks.

Since his May 1996 retirement, Dixie Poker Ace lived a long and happy life turned out in the pastures of Peach Lane Farms where he was a beloved fixture. "It was a honor and privilege to be his caretaker for the 22 plus years he resided at my farm," says Pitre. "It's like losing a member of my family."

### **The Jockey Club Considers Rule Regarding Breeding Stallions**

The Jockey Club board of stewards, concerned with the narrowing of the diversity of the Thoroughbred gene pool, announced September 6, its consideration of a rule to limit the annual breeding of individual stallions starting with the 2021 breeding season.

The Jockey Club, established in 1894, is the keeper of the American Stud Book and maintains the Principal Rules and Requirements of the American Studbook in order

to ensure the welfare of the Thoroughbred breed.

As has been widely reported, the size of the North American foal crop has diminished significantly, from 37,499 in 2007 to the 20,500 estimated for 2020

In 2007, 37 stallions reported in excess of 140 mares bred each from a total of 3,865 stallions. By 2010, that number had declined to 24. Since then, the number has nearly doubled to 43 stallions reporting 140 or more mares bred from a population of stallions that now stands at less than one-half that of 2007.

On the mare side, in 2007, 5,894 mares (9.5% of the total) were bred by stallions that covered more than 140 mares. By 2019, 7,415 mares (27% of the total) were covered by stallions with books of more than 140, a threefold increase.

The combination of these changes has resulted in a substantial increase in the percentage of foals produced by a discreet segment of stallions — signaling a worrisome concentration of the gene pool.

The board of stewards of The Jockey Club is considering a cap of 140 mares bred per individual stallion per calendar year in North America, phased-in, as follows:

Stallions entering stud service for the first time in 2020 would be exempt from the 140 limit through the 2023 season

Stallions that entered stud service in 2019 would be exempt through the 2022 season

Stallions that entered stud service in 2018 would be exempt through the 2021 season

Stallions that entered service in 2017 or prior would be subject to the 140 cap as of January 1, 2021

The stewards will continue to study the decreasing diversity of the Thoroughbred gene pool and its cause and potential effects over the course of time.

### **Study Connects Rise in Inbreeding to Larger Books**

An analysis of inbreeding over 45 years shows the biggest increase during 1996-2006.

2011 study showing an increase in inbreeding in the Thoroughbred during a 45-year period from 1961-2006 also concluded the majority of the increase occurred during the last 10 years of the study period—a time coinciding with a sharp rise in the number of stallions being bred to books of 100 mares or more.

Dr. Matthew Binns was the lead author of the study "Inbreeding in the Thoroughbred horse" that appeared in a June 2011 edition of Animal Genetics. The genotyping of 467 Thoroughbreds born between 1961-2006 showed an increase in the average inbreeding coefficient. More significantly, the study notes, the majority of the increase occurred during 1996-06, when the number of North American stallions breeding 100 or more mares in a given season rose from 14 to 128.

In 1996, 14 North American stallions covered 100 mares or more. Only five years earlier only one stallion—Alydar—had bred a book of mares exceeding 100.

The first U.S. stallions to cover 100 mares in a season was Calumet Farm's Secreto in 1987 and Alydar in 1991. By 2006, the North American stallions covering books of 100 or more mares represented 3.8% of 3,992 active stallions. The number of active stallions began

Troy's success in rodeo began in high school by winning National High School Champion in 1976 and 1977 in boys cutting horses, several Championships in calf roping, team roping and cutting, as well as several all-around cowboy titles. His rodeo career continued into college as he attended McNeese State University on a full rodeo scholarship.

Troy's career as an accomplished Thoroughbred horse trainer was built on 5057 starts, 46% winning percentage in the money, with total earnings of \$15,789,018.00. After a career as a traveling horseman, Troy returned home to manage the family business at Indian Hills Country Club, and spend time with his loving family.

Survivors include his children, Tyler James Young of Lafayette, LA, Meghan Leigh Young Duplantis and husband Chase Henry Duplantis of Arnaudville, LA, Kaitlin Young LeBlanc and husband Oliver John LeBlanc, IV of Church Point, LA; mother, Shirley Leger Young of Grand Coteau; the mother of his children, Hester A. Young; his brother, Marty Young of Grand Coteau; sisters, Lea Ann Young Bullara and husband Dean of Opelousas, LA and his sister, Shirlene Young of Lafayette;

tumbling in 2008 and by 2018 was down to 1,214. The percentage of stallions covering books of 100 mares or more rose, however, to 7.4%. The percentage of stallions covering books of 125 or more mares also increased to 5.1% in 2018, up from 4.5% from 2015-17.

"It is worrisome that the increase in inbreeding that we observe is there, not spread out over a 40-year period, but is concentrated in the period following the dramatic changes made to breeding practices in the mid-1990s," the study states.

Inbreeding in itself is not a problem, said both Bailey and Binns.

"When you have a closed population and you are selecting for some trait and trying to get rid of the genes that don't contribute to that trait, the result is a loss of diversity," Bailey said. "That involves inbreeding.

The important caveat, according to Bailey and Binns, is that breeders must be vigilant in identifying any detrimental traits and work to eliminate them in their breeding programs.

"Animal breeding is a two-edged sword. You are increasing the genes you like but you can also inadvertently pick up genes that are deleterious, that could be reflected by some loss in fitness," Bailey said.

Increased inbreeding can produce a number of negative effects, of which a common one is low conception rates. Binns said reproductive depression is particularly hard to spot in Thoroughbreds because a period of substantial improvements in veterinary reproductive medicine has occurred parallel to the rise in book sizes.

The study also suggests that the Thoroughbred gene pool may include genes related to unsound-

ness, as indicated by the decline in averages starts per foal, which was documented in an analysis done by BloodHorse in 2008. The BloodHorse study showed the average starts per foal dropped 35.6% from 20.42 for foals born in the 1970s to 13.15 for foals born in 2000-03.

Concerns about the trend toward increased inbreeding and the potential for increased exposure to genetic problems moved The Jockey Club board of stewards to propose Sept. 6 that stallion book sizes in North American be capped at 140 mares.

“You are cutting the big books back a little bit, which means other stallions get more of a chance and that makes the genetic diversity in the breed a bit better,” he said.

#### Texas Yearling Sale

The Texas Summer Yearling and Mixed Sale held Monday, August 27, at Lone Star Park concluded with strong gains in average and gross receipts, signaling that the recent passage of legislation could be having a positive impact on the industry. The sale was sponsored by the Texas Thoroughbred Association and Lone Star Park.

In the yearling session, 42 of 65 head sold for a total of \$506,000, which was an increase of 22.1% from last year when 44 of 82 sold for \$414,300. This year's average came in at \$12,048, up 28% from last year's \$9,416. The median this year dropped to \$5,000 from \$7,750. Buybacks at this year's sale were 35.4% compared to 46.3% last year.

“Even with a smaller catalog this

year it's encouraging that we were able to increase the gross sales along with a big surge in the average,” said Tim Boyce, sales director. “With as much as \$25 million annually expected to be added to the Texas racing program thanks to the bill that was passed, that can only do good things for this sale and for the entire Southwest region in the coming years.”

Hip 61, a Louisiana-bred colt by champion Shanghai Bobby, topped the sale with a \$115,000 bid from Summer Grove Farm. Consigned by Clear Creek Stud LLC, agent, the March 5 foal is out of the winning Cobra King mare Viva Vega, who has produced eight winners including stakes winners Southern Dude and Viva Vegas.

While the sale-topper was bred in Louisiana, the next three highest-priced horses were all Texas-breds by leading Texas stallion Too Much Bling.

In the mixed portion of the sale, 13 of 17 head sold for a total of \$33,100. Show Me the Bling, a winning and Grade 3-placed daughter of Too Much Bling, topped the mixed session, going to CJ Thoroughbred for \$14,000. Benchmark Training Center, agent, consigned the 11-year-old broodmare who sold in foal to Alternation.

#### Texas 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale Set for March 31

The 2020 Texas 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale has been scheduled for Tuesday, March 31, at Lone Star Park. The breeze show will be held at the Dallas-area track on Sunday, March 29. The auction is a joint venture by the Texas Thoroughbred Association and Lone Star Park.

“Our yearling and mixed sale at Lone Star Park in August had gross sales and average prices both jumping by more than 20 percent, and we expect that momentum to continue into the 2-year-old sale,” said Tim Boyce, sales director. “The Southwest area has been strong for many years, and now with this very important legislation recently passed to boost the industry in Texas the region will get even stronger.”

Sale graduates will be eligible for the 2020 Texas Thoroughbred Futurity to be run in divisions for fillies and colts/geldings at Lone Star in July. The estimated purse for each division is \$100,000.

“With new legislation passed to enhance purse money at Texas tracks and funds for the Accredited Texas-bred program, there is a lot of optimism for 2020 and beyond,” said Mary Ruyle, executive director of the Texas Thoroughbred Association. “We've already noticed an uptick in interest as breeding season approaches, so that bodes well for the future of Texas racing and breeding.”

was offered to the fans and they elected trainer Bobby Barnett, jockey Calvin Borel; former general manager Tom Sweeney as well as the incomparable Alysheba as additional inductees.

Officials also introduced a new wager, Super Tuesday Pick 4, on Tuesday, June 25. The wager teamed two Caesar's Entertainment racetracks: Harrah's Louisiana Downs and Indiana Grand Racing and Casino, which both offer Tuesday matinee racing programs. Two races each Tuesday from both racetracks were selected and offered to fans at a reduced takeout of 15%.

"We were thrilled to induct honor such outstanding horses and trailblazers into our Racing Hall of Fame," said Eric Halstrom, Harrah's Louisiana Downs vice president of operations. "The fan vote was very well-received and we will certainly offer that again in 2020. It was also a great beginning for the Super Tuesday Pick 4, which gave us an opportunity to attract new fans."

***Carlos Lozada Wins His First Leading Rider Title***

Carlos Lozada was dominant throughout the meet, topping a very competitive jockey colony to claim his first ever leading rider title. The 34-year-old native of Puerto Rico finished the meet with a record of 428 starts, 95 wins, 70 seconds and 52 thirds and purses of \$1,076,410.

He began riding in the United States in 2007 after attending Puerto Rico's Escuela Vocacional Hipica, the famed jockey school with a noted list of riders, including Irad Ortiz, Jr, Jose Ortiz as well as 2018 Harrah's Louisiana Downs top-ranked rider, Emanuel Nieves.

The soft-spoken rider was the

17th-ranked rider in 2018 at Louisiana Downs, but united with former jockey and highly successful agent, Ronald Ardoin, this year.

"There is no doubt that Ronald made a big difference for me," said Lozada. "He works hard in the mornings and got me a lot of mounts. He won so many races in his career and was very helpful when I asked for advice."

One of the biggest wins of the meet came on Super Derby Day when Lozada guided Sugarland Thoroughbreds LLC's homebred Eskenformore to victory in the \$60,000 River Cities at odds of 30-1. He had ridden the 6-year-old mare, trained by James Hodges.

"I rode her like I knew her," stated Lozada. "I felt she needed to be closer to the lead and knew she had plenty left for the finish."

Winning leading rider honors at Harrah's Louisiana Downs meant a great deal to the devoted family man, supported by his wife, Eileen Quinones and their three sons: Anthony, Jean Carlos and Jandriel.

It was also a very successful season for Joel Dominguez, who finished second with 91 trips to the winner's circle, edging Lozada in purses, with mounts earning \$1,091,671. Dominguez, who was third in the standings last year, is represented by retired rider Don Simington. Jockey Aubrie Green finished third with 54 victories; a solid step up from her seventh-place finish here in 2018. Richard Eramia and Hector Del-Cid tied for fourth with 47 trips to the winner's circle.

***Joey Foster Wins His Third Louisiana Downs Leading Trainer***

Benton, Louisiana horseman Joey Foster picked up his third leading trainer title at Harrah's

Louisiana Downs, winning 54 races from 218 starters to top his fellow conditioners this meet.

The very popular trainer won his first title here in 2016, repeating the feat in 2017 and finishing second to Karl Broberg last year. He saddled a mix of claiming and allowance horses throughout the meet, with standouts including Mizztic Tale, who won three of his four starts this meet for owners Brett Day and Kevin Spretz. Also, Play on Becky picked up her third victory of the season on Wednesday, September 25 for her breeder and owner Jim Horton.

"I want to thank each of my owners for their support," said Foster. "They are the ones that put the show on; training horses is the easy part, but keeping great owners is key."

Foster also acknowledged his wife, Cheryl, who he refers to as "the backbone" of the barn, and the hard work of assistant trainer, Amanuel Ortiz, affectionately known as "Shorty".

Foster cited Our Lost Love, a 2-year-old filly Louisiana-bred daughter of Half Ours, as one of his runners to watch. Bred and owned by Tri-Star Racing LLC, she broke her maiden impressively here on September 14.

"She ran a great race and earned an 83 Beyer (speed figure)," said Foster. "We will run her on Louisiana Champions Day (December 14) at Fair Grounds."

Last year's leading conditioner, Karl Broberg, finished second with 45 wins. Beverly Burrell, who saddled 18 winners last year, finished the meet with 28 victories, including a stakes score with Run Rocket in the \$60,000 A. L. (Red) Erwin on the Super Derby card. Steve

Asmussen and Jorge Lara tied for fourth with 20 winners each.

**Leading Owner Title Goes to End Zone Athletics, Inc.**

End Zone Athletics, Inc. repeated as owner of the meet, and unlike last year, when the title went down to the final day, the national leader held a comfortable lead throughout the meet. The highly successful partnership of Karl Broberg and Matt Johanson won 25 races this meet to earn leading owner honors.

"I want to thank Darwin Quevado, my assistant at Louisiana Downs for all he has done," said Broberg. "We used quite a few riders, but I was pleasantly surprised by Aubrie Green."

Dream Walkin Farms, Inc. was second in the standings with 14 wins and horses owned by Ronnie P. Ward made 11 trips to the winner's circle. Indian Creek Thoroughbred Farms, LLC and Penny Scarberry tied for fourth with ten wins in the 2019 Thoroughbred meet.

Roger Heitzmann call for all conflict policies to be forwarded so that they made be read aloud. As those were collected Warren moved forward with the meeting.

**Committee Reports:**

**By-Law: Val Murrell – Chairman**

Val informed the board that an agreement was made by the committee that the change that was being contemplated was not enough to have an impact on the state of the association. If other state programs are raising the stakes we needed to make a greater impact. Several proposals were made. Michele Rodriguez made a proposal by adjusting the breeders awards to allow foals bred by Louisiana Stallions to receive a higher breeders award than those by stallions that stand in other states. Discussion took place on how this would be done and how it would affect the funds. Therese Arroyo helped Michele by providing numbers based on last year's numbers. The numbers were tossed around and discussed.

Brett Brinkman pointed out that he believes that most of the La Bred foals that were by out of state stallions are slated to be sold at auction, not for the breeders to race.

Brett made a proposal that we look into the possibility of setting a value program. Rather than paying breeders awards on the purse, we set a value for purse based on claiming price. This value price would be based on average of what each track pays on each condition of each race. It would be time consuming, and it would have to be renewed each year, but he believes it would help the breeders who have horses running here year round.

Discussion took place on this subject for a period of time.

Charlotte Clavier brought up the subject of Horse Rescue and the bad press we receive by media outlets and persons against racing. Discussion took place with no action being taken at this time as we will address it further after new plans that are in place have had time to develop.

Michele Rodriguez moved back to her proposal and discussion on amending our rules to make them more friendly and enhanced for our breeder. She asked that no action be taken today but we need to get together and work something out.

Michele than brought up the idea that the board go back to doing a workshop/retreat. In the past the LTBA Directors would attend a retreat to discuss matters such as this.

Brett informed the board that there is talk in other organizations on the national level that there will be some mandatory restrictions on racing, basically pressure on race dates as well as horse starts, works, times on lasix, etc.

Roger Heitzmann introduced a possible change to our rules. That change would eliminate most of the rules such as sale mares and departing mares with just the change of all dates being moved to October 1st. Mares have to be back from breeding by October 1st from breeding to remain in the program or can leave the program after October 1st, eliminating the August 1st and December 31st rules. Discussion took place.

Warren instructed Michele Rodriguez and Michelle LaVoice to come up with a date to have a retreat. The dates chosen were October 1st and 2nd. He instructed Roger to set it up and notify the board so that we can work out a new plan.

**Finance & Audit: Tom Early – Chairman**

Tom requested that we wait till the end of the meeting and move the discussion to Executive Session.

Roger requested that we move away from the scheduled agenda and hear the Grievance of Ms. Jennifer Stewart and the ruling made by Roger and the Grievance committee on the mare Won View and her foal by Pimpernel.

**Grievance: Michele LaVoice – Chairperson**

Ms. Jennifer Stewart requested the board hear her reason for not being able to fulfill the requirements of her mare Won View. She made her presentation to the board as well as answering questions of members of the board. No decision was made by the board at this time and the case was sent back to the Grievance Committee.

**Government Affairs: Jake Delhomme – Chairman**

Warren Harang informed the board that he and a couple of others met with Governor Edwards and suggestions were made on how he could help our industry. Discussion took place about rules and regulations in regards to sitting on the Racing Commission.

Warren then suggested that those in attendance introduce themselves.

**Inspection: Brett Brinkman – Chairman**

Brett had no report for this meeting. Roger is going to look at a possible problem that arose yesterday upon returning to the office.

**LTBA/HBPA Liaison Committee: Val Murrell – Chairman**

Val Murrell had no report for this meeting

**LTBA/LSRC: Jake Delhomme – Chairman**

Jake was absent and there was no report for this meeting

**Membership & Nominating Committee: Charlotte Clavier – Chairperson**

Charlotte notified the board of the work Roger is doing to help increase the membership.

**PAC Committee: Michele Rodriguez – Chairperson**

No report for this meeting.

**Salary & Benefits: Tom Early – Chairman**

Tom requested that we move to Executive Session to have this discussion as well.

**New Business:**

Roger presented to the board a new list of Board Members as well as a list of last year's committees that will be moving forward unless Warren wants changes. Warren suggested to the board that if they wished to be added to or removed from a specific committee they notify Roger and it will be done.

**Old Business:**

None reported.

**Date, Time and Place of Next Board of Directors Meeting.**

October 1st and 2nd along with a retreat at a place to be determined.

Roger then read onto the record the possible conflicts listed by board members from their conflict of interest policy:

Val Murrell – His daughter is also a member of the board as well as Farm Manager of Clear Creek Stud. He stated that multiple members do business with Clear Creek Stud including members

of the board such as Tom Early, and Warren Harang, etc.

Michele Rodriguez – She states that she is the Owner/Manager of Elite Thoroughbreds who does business with many members and board members. She is a Director of Equine Sales and of Louisiana Horse Rescue. She also states she does business with Stemmans Supply as well as Ranch Outlet which are owned by two members of the Board.

Brett Brinkman – Brett is a cousin by marriage to fellow board member Charlotte Clavier. He is the owner of Brett Brinkman Training Stables doing business with many members of the LTBA. He also owns and breeds stallions whose services are sold to many members of the LTBA.

Michelle LaVoice – She works for her father Val as Farm Manager of Clear Creek Stud who does business with many members of the LTBA as well as members of the board.

Jay Adcock – Jay is the owner of Red River Farm as well as a shareholder in Equine Sales Company. He does business with members of the board and the membership of the LTBA. He is a partner in mares and stallions with Neal McFadden, Jim Montgomery, and Jake Delhomme, all board members of the LTBA. He also has business dealings with many members of the LTBA breeding, selling, and buying horses.

Charlotte Clavier – Charlotte is the President of Stemmans Supply Inc., the Vice President of Traders Rest Farm, Vice President of the LHBPA including a trustee of the workman's comp., as well as the Treasurer of REAP. With these positions she has business dealings with all horsemen.

Tom Early – Tom has shares in stallions Custom for Carlos at Clear Creek Stud, Apriority, at Elite Thoroughbreds, and breeds mares with stallions at Whispering Oaks (Carrol Castille).

Warren Harang III – Warren both breeds and boards mares at Clear Creek Stud which is owned and operated by Val Murrell and Michelle LaVoice.

Roger Heitzmann – Has brothers who participate in the business with members of the association as well as members of the board.

Charlotte Clavier explained a function in the making called Horses for Hero's which is set to be held on September 4th at Blue Star Racing Farm. She made a motion that the LTBA contribute with a \$500 sponsorship. Warren seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Charlotte made a motion that we sponsor lapel pins for the Shantel Lanerie Brest Cancer Fund and forward leftover monies up to \$500 to sponsorship of the organization. Warren seconded the motion which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Tom made a motion to enter into Executive Session. This motion was seconded by Michelle LaVoice, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Charlotte made a motion to exit Executive Session. This motion was seconded by Michele Rodriguez, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Tom Early made a motion to recognize the donation of the

Breeders Sales Company of \$42,225 to the books of the LTBA. Jay Adcock seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Tom Early made a motion for Meeting Expense to be increased from \$25,000 to \$35,000 to cover plans for later in the year. Michele LaVoice seconded the motion which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Michele LaVoice made a motion to increase trophy expense from \$8500 to \$15000. Tom Early seconded the motion which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Tom Early made a motion to elect an early renewal to switch insurance plans keeping the cost under \$100,000 but ask before we bind if we can cancel it anytime within the next twelve months.

Val Murrell seconded the motion which was voted on and passed unanimously.

All members of the Board acknowledged they have received a copy of the financials and understand they have been filed with approval.

Tom Early made a motion to adjourn. Michele Rodriguez seconded the motion which was voted on and passed unanimously.

Warren Harang called the meeting to order and asked Roger Heitzmann to call the roll. A quorum was present and the meeting was ready to proceed with business.

Charlotte Clavier made a motion that Harry Benoit set up a meeting between representatives of the LTBA and and Governor Edwards. This motion was seconded by Michele Rodriguez, which was voted on and passed unanimously.

**Membership & Nominating Committee: Roger Heitzmann – Acting Chairman**

Roger informed the Board that no one wanted to participate in the election as a candidate other then the board members seeking re-election. He also stated that the by-laws need to be adjusted to include the rules to follow if this would happen again.

Discussion took place about the membership number and its ties to racing and the number of mares breeding. Proposed changes to the domicile rule were suggested.

**Salary & Benefits: Tom Early – Chairman**

A motion was made to enter into Executive Session by Charlotte Clavier which was seconded by Carrol Castille. All were

in agreement and the board entered Executive session. Charlotte made a motion to exit Executive Session. This motion was seconded by Tom Early with no objection. Charlotte then made a motion to make a budget adjustment by raising the amount of the salary budget by \$10,000. Roger is instructed to make the adjustment and what it is to be used for to Therese Arroyo, the LTBA accountant. This motion was seconded by Carrol Castille which was voted on and passed unanimously.

**New Business:**

Alan Peltier made a request to send a mare out of state. It was discussed and found that she can leave the program.

Charlotte brought up an HBPA position that may be made in the future. If a race is cancelled the HBPA may begin to compensate horsemen with a payment to cover coast.

Roger informed the board on the state of Louisiana bred races being used at this point of the current race meets.

**Old Business:**

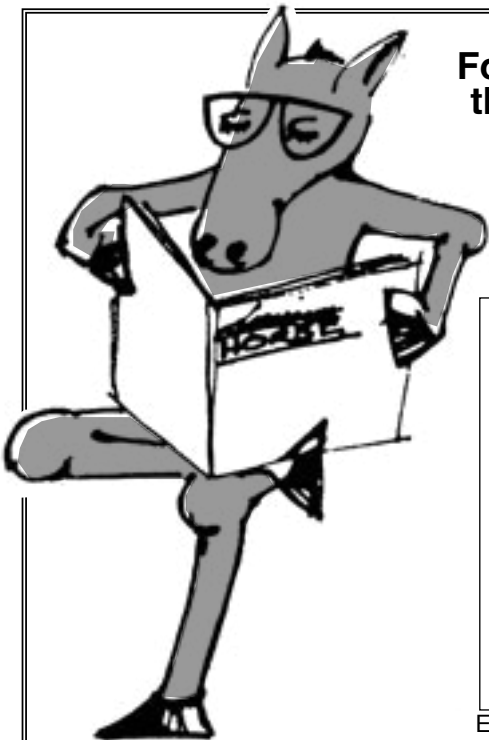
None reported.
