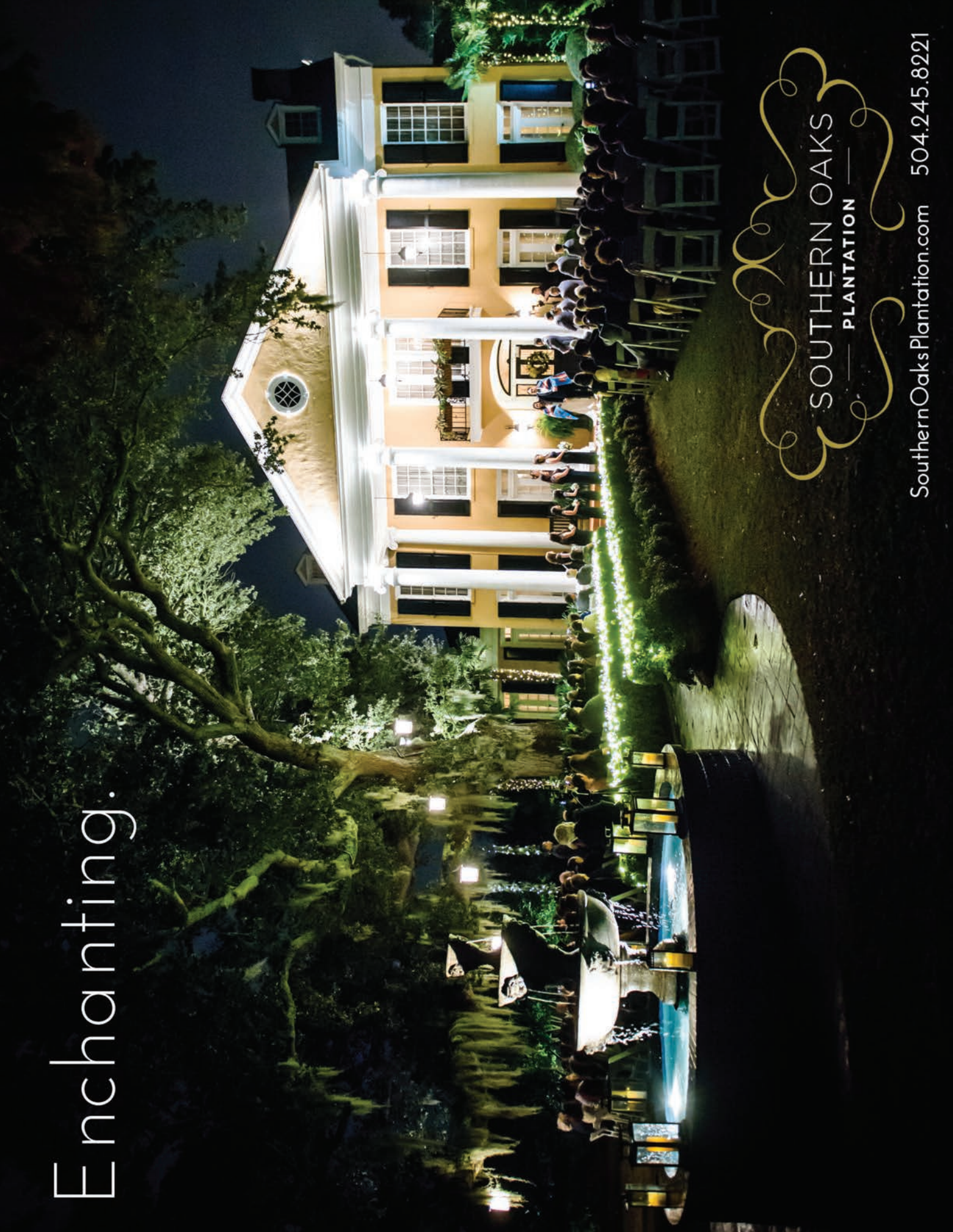

LOUISIANA TOBA BREEDER OF THE YEAR

Set-Hut LLC: Jake Delhomme

Breaux Bridge native Jake Delhomme is known by Louisiana sports fans for his football career. Delhomme became a star NFL quarterback after setting Ragin' Cajun football records that still stand. As a pro-ball player, he led the Carolina Panthers to the Super Bowl in 2003 highlighting a 15-year NFL career. During his professional football career, he played for NFL Europe, New Orleans Saints, Carolina Panthers, Cleveland Browns and Houston Texans. He was inducted in the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2015

Before Delhomme learned to throw a football, he learned about caring for the horses his father raced at Louisiana tracks. Jake's grandfather bred horses, and Jake's father was a jockey who began racing at young age. Jake has called horses his first love...“I didn't grow up hunting, fishing, or golfing. I grew up in a barn.” Now, Jake Delhomme's Set-Hut LLC has been named Louisiana's TOBA Breeder of the Year.

Jake owns and breeds horses as Set-Hut LLC, which his father Jerry and brother Jeff train at the

Evangeline Downs Training Center. He is however “hands-on” in the shedrow with whatever needs to be done.

“I strictly run in Louisiana and have Louisiana-breds,” said Jake. Jake's current favorite Louisiana Bred is Forest Lake. A 2012 bay filly by Forest Lake out of winning Kris S. mare, Oval, Forest Lake was foaled and raised at his home. She is Jake's first multiple stakes winner. Forest Lake's record currently stands at 5 wins, 8 seconds

and 2 thirds from 20 starts with \$375,220 in earnings. She has won and placed in stakes at two, three and four. She won the \$150,000 Louisiana Premier Night Distaff Stakes at Delta Downs this past February, and since ran 2nd in the Louisiana Legends Distaff at Evangeline Downs in July. Her racing career will resume in the fall.

Jake is eagerly anticipating the starts of a pair of home-bred Louisiana-bred two-year-olds. He has a Songandaprayer filly and a Dahaar gelding that are “showing well” which he is hoping will soon be showing up in the winner's circle.

Jake takes to heart being named Louisiana TOBA Breeder of the Year. Not just a breeder, he gives back to this industry. He has served on the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association Board of Directors since 2012 and is a past president of the Board and currently serves as the first vice president. “I love reading up on the sport, researching, following the trends. I truly enjoy all of that, he says. “I'm very humbled to win this award.”

BOOK REVIEW:

The Fair Grounds Through the Lens: Photographs and Memories of Horse Racing in New Orleans
by Peggy Scott Laborde Principal photography by Louisia Hodges, Jr.

Louisiana racing fans are well familiar with Fair Grounds. Since 1872, the New Orleans Fair Grounds has been home to exhibitions, boxing matches, baseball games, and even special events like ostrich racing. Now owned by Churchill Downs, Inc., the Fair Grounds has withstood hurricanes, fire, and bankruptcy and stands today as a vibrant sports and festival venue.

The history of one of America's oldest Thoroughbred horse-racing tracks is chronicled in this book. This is the kind of book one can enjoy with a cup of coffee, between races at the track, or curled up for a couple hours. The story of the track is told here through interviews, rare photographs, and archival lithographs. Perspectives come from a variety of people from trainers, breeders, journalists, jockeys, owners, and horsemen and women of every level of the game.

Photographs include the color and personality of the city as well as the fans in addition to the more

traditional race images.

Peggy Scott Laborde is the producer and host of Steppin' Out, which airs on WYES-TV in New Orleans. She has garnered praise for her extensive efforts in conserving the arts and the history of New Orleans.

Fair Grounds official track photographer Louis Hodges, Jr., took his first picture of the New Orleans Fair Grounds when he was twelve years old. His family has been documenting the track for more than half a century.

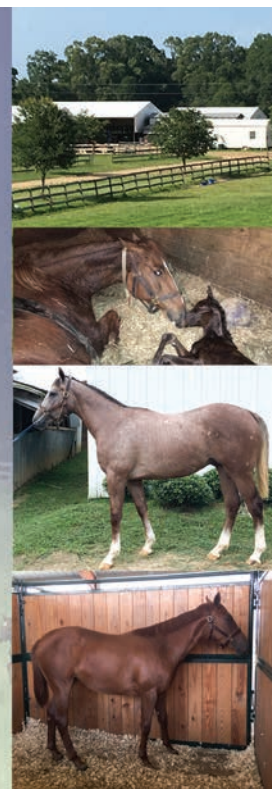

In choosing breeding stock, depth of pedigree is always something to be considered. Just as you are more likely to draw a high card from a deck stacked with aces and royals, a horse whose pedigree is stocked with high-quality ancestors is more likely to pass desirable traits to a foal than a chance-bred horse, all other factors being equal. And in Louisiana, few stallions can boast a better genetic background than Red River Farm's Interactif, who backed up his regal heritage with high-class performance on the track.

Currently second on the Louisiana second-crop and juvenile sire lists, Interactif has sired 18 winners from 54 named foals in his first two crops as of October 6—a good performance considering that on paper, he is more the sort of horse to get runners that improve with age. He is one of the best sons of Pin Oak Farm's premier stallion Broken Vow, himself a son of Unbridled and the listed stakes-winning Nijinsky II mare Wedding Picture; Wedding Picture, in turn, is from the family of Pin Oak foundation mare Take a Stand. The winner of three graded stakes as a 4-year-old, Broken Vow is one of the best breed-to-race sires in the country and routinely bequeaths size, scope and substance to his foals.

On the distaff side of his pedigree, Interactif traces to the rich tapestry of breeding created by the Phipps family, which has been at the forefront of the American racing scene for seven decades. A half brother to grade III-placed stakes winner Stretching (by Red Ransom), he was produced from Broad Pennant, an unraced daughter of multiple Grade I winner and 1994 American champion sire Broad Brush. Like Broken Vow, Broad Brush routinely sired progeny that were sound, rugged and trained on well.

Broad Pennant was produced from the winner Pennant Champion (by Mr. Prospector), also the dam of 2011 Bourbon Stakes (G3T) winner Animal Spirits (by Arch) and the second dam of 2014 Delta Downs Jackpot Stakes (G3) winner Ocho Ocho Ocho (by Street Sense). Pennant Champion herself is a full sister to 1993 Jockey Club Gold Cup (G1) winner Miner's Mark, 2001 Oaklawn Handicap (G1) winner

Traditionally and multiple Grade I-placed Our Emblem, sire of 2002 Kentucky Derby (G1) and Preakness Stakes (G1) winner War Emblem. She is also a half sister to multiple Grade I winner My Flag (G1), dam of 2002 champion 2-year-old filly Storm Flag Flying (by Storm Cat) and stakes winner With Flying Colors (by A.P. Indy) and second dam of Grade II winner Parading (by Pulpit). In addition, Pennant Champion is a half sister to Grade II-placed Salute (by Unbridled), dam of 2014 Belmont Derby Invitational Stakes (G1T) winner Mr. Speaker (by Pulpit), and to Title Seeker (by Monarchos), dam of 2010 Iowa Oaks (G3) winner Seeking the Title (by Seeking the Gold).

Pennant Champion and her siblings were produced from one of the greatest race mares of all time, undefeated Personal Ensign (by Private Account), who was the 1996 Kentucky Broodmare of the Year. A full sister to multiple Grade I winner and useful sire Personal Flag, Personal Ensign is out of 1988 Kentucky Broodmare of the Year Grecian Banner, a daughter of the excellent sire Hoist the Flag and two-time Argentine champion Dorine. In turn, Dorine was sired by 1960 Argentine champion sire Aristophanes out of the crack Argentine sprinter Doria and was bred on the same sire/broodmare sire cross as the great Forli, winner of Argentina's Quadruple Crown series. Bloodlines just don't get any better than that.

Bred and owned by Wertheimer et Frere (who also bred and campaigned three-time Breeders' Cup Mile, G1, winner Goldikova), Interactif was quick enough as a 2-year-old to break his maiden in a five-furlong maiden special weight on dirt at Monmouth, but he quickly showed that his true talents lay around longer distances on the grass. After winning the With Anticipation Stakes (G3T)

with a strong turn of foot at 8½ furlongs at the 2009 Saratoga meeting, he won the Bourbon Stakes (G3T) at the same distance at Keeneland and then was third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G2T) at Santa Anita. The following year, he won the National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame Stakes (G2T) over nine furlongs at Saratoga and placed in two more Grade II races on turf and synthet-



ics as well. He finished his career having won or placed in eight of his 12 starts for earnings of \$563,700.

In conformation, Interactif has much of the scope and substance of Broken Vow but is more elegant and refined, reflecting the influence of the Phipps breeding program. He has good rein length, a well laid shoulder and the strong hindquarters and hind leg typical of Mr. Prospector's descendants. His build suggests that he will be able to stretch out a mare who needs a bit of leg and scope without losing too much power and substance.

Review of the history of Interactif's female family suggests that he may suit mares carrying the bloodlines of Roberto, Storm Cat and A.P. Indy, all of which have produced good horses in crosses with Personal Ensign and her descendants. He may also be a good choice for Danzig-line mares, and breeders willing to experiment with further line breeding to Mr. Prospector may fare well with mares tracing to Carson City (whose dam Blushing Promise is bred on a reverse of the Nijinsky II/Blushing Groom cross that produced Broken Vow's dam Wedding Picture). In addition, he seems to be doing well with mares from the Deputy Minister male line.

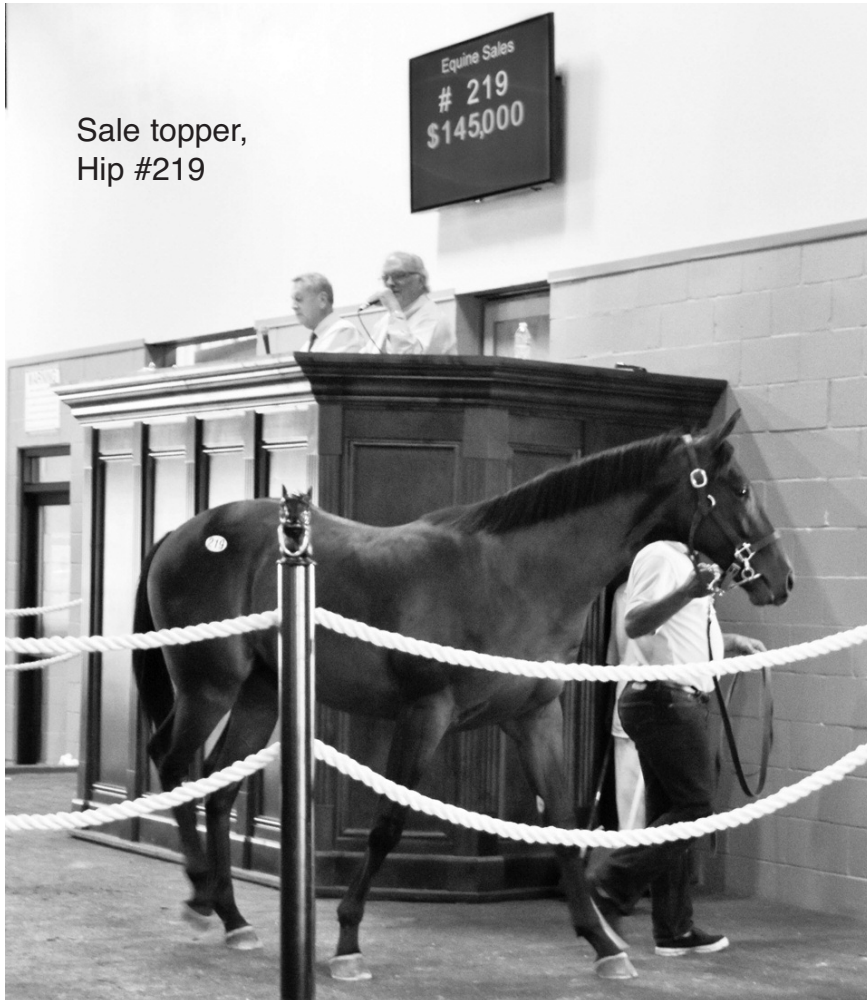

The bidding for the half brother to stakes winner Cook Some Rice and stakes placed winner Carmen's Mystery was fast and furious. When the hammer fell, Eddie Woods' Quarter Pole Enterprises LLC had purchased the March 2015 colt for \$145,000. Clear Creek Stud, LLC, Agent was the consignor.

That marked the highest price for

a yearling at the sale since Equine Sales Company started in 2012. The colt was bred and consigned by Clear Creek Stud LLC, agent.

The second-highest price, and top selling filly, was a Louisiana-bred daughter of Overanalyze who sold for \$60,000 from the consignment of breeder 4M Ranch, agent, also purchased by Eddie Woods' Quarter Pole Enterprises LLC. The Louisiana-bred is the first foal out of the Congrats mare Happy Destiny, whose dam is multiple Grade 3 winner and stakes producer Dance o'my Life.

The Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association (LTBA) and Equine Sales of Louisiana announced in early March of this year a mutual agreement with the purpose of encouraging and supporting a single annual yearling sale for Louisiana thoroughbred

horse owners, breeders, trainers and potential buyers in Louisiana.

"Our number one priority continues to be the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association and its members," said Harang. "We are moving forward as a unified group to solidify the future of our industry in Louisiana. This sale is a good example of what can happen when we all work together."

"I thought we had a good sale, especially considering the current market," said Foster Bridewell, sales director for Equine Sales Company. "By teaming with the LTBA to present a unified sale, we were able to increase the average, median and gross sales from last year. The consignors did their part by bringing quality horses to the sale, and the buyers responded to that."

FIRST TO ARRIVE

SCOTT JONES, FAIR GROUNDS RACING SECRETARY
IS A MAN WHO TRULY ENJOYS HIS JOB

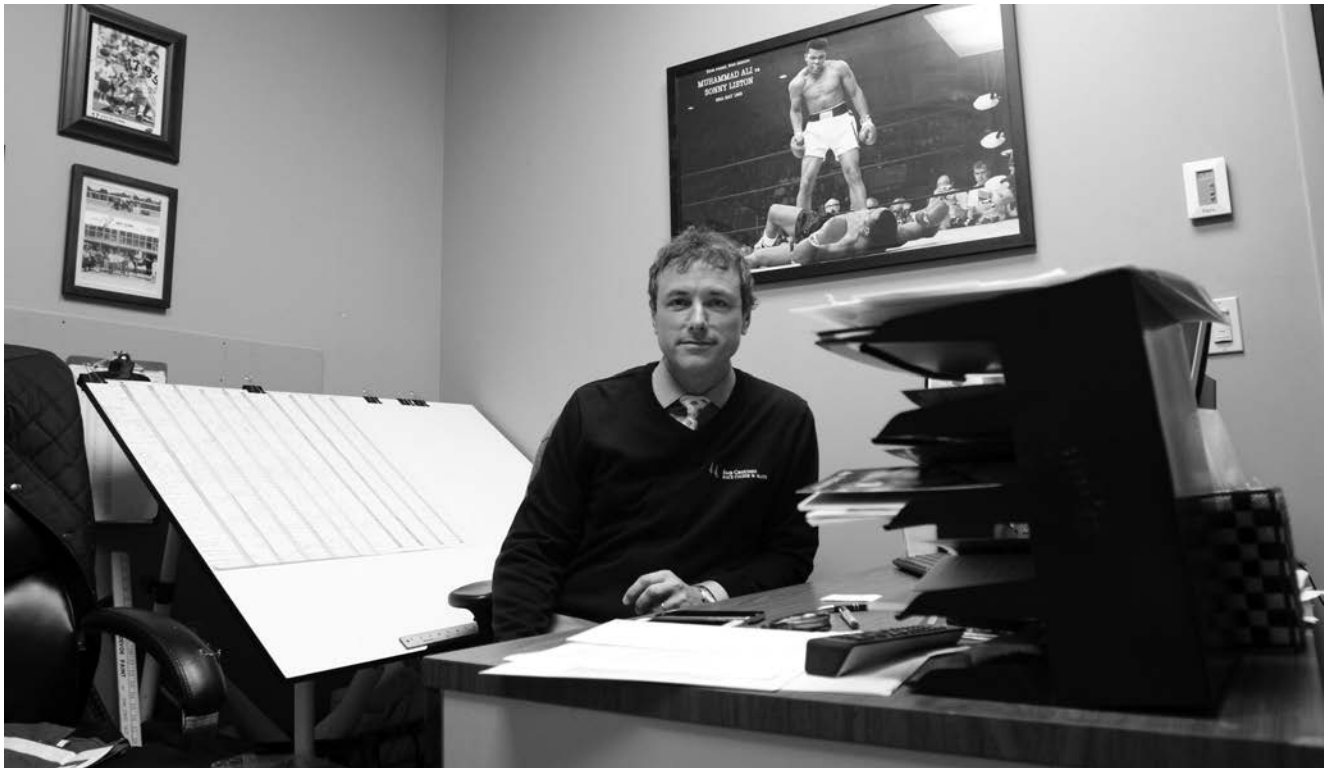
First to arrive. It's 8:15 on a September morning and Fair Grounds racing secretary Scott Jones is fumbling with a jammed stapler. The phone rings. Stapler in one hand, cell phone in the other, Jones talks to a trainer in Kentucky, who is asking for stalls for the upcoming meet. A maintenance worker comes into the office, asking for paint brushes. Jones stays in stride. Relaxed and easy going on the outside, he is precise and meticulous when it comes to multi-tasking.

Within minutes, the issues of the paint brushes, the phone call and the stubborn stapler are swept away and Jones is sitting in his office. It's time to change leads and address the more serious mat-



ter of allocating stalls. He logs into the desktop computer and begins researching the past performances of horses. The purpose of Jones' scrutiny is similar to a lawyer deciding on a jury pool. He is looking for horses that have the profile and potential to enter races at Fair Grounds.

“Technology has changed the way we do our jobs,” Jones explains, pointing to horse that had not run in over two years. “Now you have so much information at your fingertips. Twenty years ago you had a list of trainers on a yellow

legal pad and they all asked for twenty stalls. The rule of thumb in this business is that every trainer asks for more stalls than what they actually need.”

Like any administrative position where decisions have to be made, a racing secretary must accept occasional reality checks. “The Fair Grounds is winter racing so you are always going to have a few stalls with horses that are not going to run,” Jones says. “Could be a stakes horse that is laid up and preparing for a spring campaign. You have to accept that a bit with the bigger barns.”

Jones sees the Fair Grounds turf course as a blessing with pimples.

“The turf course is huge for us in terms of recruiting,” he says. “Most of the top trainers have turf horses so it just makes sense that we will attract big name stables. But you still have to look for a balanced percentage in the horse population. We can't run ten turf races every day.”

Pain first. Pleasure second. Jones considers allocating stalls the most difficult but most most important aspect of his job description. There are 1,827 stalls on the Fair Grounds backside at his disposal. “Making sure those trainers are bringing in horses that are runners and will fill races sets the tone for the entire season,” he says with emphasis.

Jones' path to his his first year as

a racing secretary was not cookie cutter traditional. Born just outside of Liverpool, England, Jones grew up accustomed to the city life. No one in his family had any interest or involvement in the racing game. A passion for horse racing attracted the young Jones to the Northern Racing School in Doncaster, England. A twelve week curriculum exposed Jones to every aspect of thoroughbred racing. “We lived and worked on site,” he remembers. “We rode on the gallops, we mucked stalls, we tacked up the horses and we had classroom schooling.”

The culmination of the Northern Racing School's program was a two

year apprenticeship at a trainer's yard. After his two year tenure, Jones went to Newmarket as an exercise rider. "Across the pond in England an exercise rider is assigned three horses," Jones says. "You are responsible for their care as well as taking them out on the gallops. It's a whole different ball game than what it is here in the States."

Unless you cross the line once in awhile you will never know what's on the others side. In 1997 with a three month working visa in his

suitcase, Jones traveled to Palm Beach Downs in Florida. "In my mind it was just a winter getaway," Jones said with a smile. It did not take long for Jones to make his return. This time with an 18 month visa, Jones was exercising horses at Delaware Park and the Fair Hill Training facility. "I was just bouncing around," Jones says of his gypsy itinerary.

Equipment change. When a job came up in the racing office at Delaware Park, Jones entered the world of coats and ties. "I was fas-

cinated with the opportunity," he remembers. "I was always browsing through the condition books in the tack rooms. I was eager for a change. I went through the interview and they gave me the job."

The willingness and enthusiasm to accept a challenge brought Jones to the Fair Grounds racing office in 2006. Management changes worked in his favor. When Jason Boulet came on board as Racing Secretary, Jones was promoted to Stakes Coordinator. In 2013, Jones was promoted to assistant Racing

Secretary. The succession and momentum continued. With Jason Boulet given an expansion of responsibility as Senior Director of Racing, Jones became the new Racing Secretary.

The 42-year-old, who looks ten years younger, brings his own style and substance to the position. The condition book (a day-by-day outline of the types of races to be offered) receives the majority of Jones' time and attention. The printed condition book is a trainer's encyclopedia, containing the calendar for the 81 days of racing, jock mount fees, stakes schedule, an index of races by age, sex, class level and distance, phone numbers of jockey agents and a comprehensive section on track rules and policies.

“In previous years, the condition book was on a 12 day cycle,” Jones says. “This year is a thicker book because we will only have four books. The first book takes us all the way to New Year's Eve and after that one per month. Everybody writes a different book. This is what works for me.”

Louisiana based trainer Eddie Johnston is on-board and appreciative of the new condition book. “You can see so much further and gives trainers a better opportunity to plan,” Johnston explains. “Looking at six weeks of races, you can think two cycles ahead for your horse. It takes out the guess work.”

Johnston is one of the trainers to

take advantage of the Fair Grounds backside opening on October 1st. “All the Louisiana horsemen that need to come here have a place to go,” Jones says. “The accommodations are the best they have every been. In my ten years here the backside has never looked better. It is spotless. Getting here early means that the trainers have access to the track and training five or six weeks before the regular meet opens.”

Developing rapport with the trainers and jock agents has been at the top of Jones' list of priorities in his first year as racing secretary. A management philosophy of inclusion and friendly customer service seems to be both effortless and natural to Jones. It has trickled down to his young staff. “We are pretty laid back,” Jones says of his crew that are mostly in their early to mid-twenties. “We have staff that knows what they have to do so there isn't much of a need for me to get in the way. When hiccups come along we work through it.”

Fair Grounds has a long tradition of the jock agents submitting 80% of the entries. “We want our staff to get along with those agents,” Jones continues. “The expectation is for us to all work together as a team. There is nothing wrong with mixing in a little fun with the work.”

Aside from an occasional round of golf, Jones personal enjoyment comes from a yearning for travel and absorbing different cultures. In his British accent, Jones refers to

his travel experience as “hop arounds” that have taken him in recent years to Dublin, Ireland, Spain, Venice, Paris and Mexico City. His travel companion and wife Cara is Jones' travel companion. “We got to chatting and dating after a few hair cuts,” Jones says of how he met his wife.

Free time for Jones is infrequent once the Fair Grounds meet is underway. “For a racing secretary there is no such thing as a typical day,” Jones says. “You are pretty much consumed by the work. Even when driving the car in the morning I am thinking of what we can do to make this place better. Whatever is necessary to doing something to make people want to come to the Fair Grounds. At home or in the office--it takes over your mindset.”

His exuberance is not fool's gold. Its more like a gold nugget of appreciation. “What I do is more of a way of life than a job,” Jones says. “Any time you can make a living and be in racing and have a home base like I do you have to see yourself as fortunate. In terms of job satisfaction, I would guess that my situation places me in about one percent of the population.”

Living the Life

The allure of breeding Thoroughbreds cannot be whittled down to a single factor. It is a business that is steeped in lore and legend, substantial risk, and great reward. It requires a love of the horse, expertise, and a gambler's instinct to the subtle nuance of probability. Channon Farm's owner Gillian "Jill" Channon Taylor attributes the appeal of breeding thoroughbreds to her passion for the horse. It is a labor intensive job with long hours and little sleep. At the end of the day the dust never settles on her boots; it merely hovers.

"Thoroughbreds are a lifelong calling; it is in my blood," said Taylor with a slight British accent reminiscent of her upbringing in the United Kingdom. "It is a job where you are on call 24/7. You have to love the highs and the lows of it; be a bit of a gambler and a risk taker. There is nothing more rewarding

than raising foals and watching them grow and thrive. It is even more exciting when they make it to the winner's circle. That is the biggest thrill by far."

Channon Farm, located in Doyline, Louisiana, encompasses 86 acres of prime farmland and specializes in breeding, boarding, and private and public sales consignments and acquisitions. The farm supports anywhere from sixty to eighty thoroughbred mares, foals, yearlings and racing prospects with the help of her dedicated husband Roy and a hard working staff of ten. The 46-stall main barn with vast, airy foaling stalls is only a few steps away from Taylor's front door—equestrian convenience at its finest. While many horse farms have sporty purebred dogs gallivanting around the farm, Taylor has her own unique farm canine in the resident Labrador Retriever and hound mix she fondly refers to as

the "houndador" who is her constant companion.

"Our home is connected to the barn, which might not be for everyone but certainly works great for us," Taylor said. "Instead of hiking to the barn in the middle of the night all we have to do is open the door and we're in the barn. Rather perfect for the lifestyle don't you think?"

In an era when maintaining a strong boarding business requires an ever-changing marketing strategy, Taylor credits a good deal of her success to a consistent clientele base, attention to detail and a lucrative state-bred program.

"The boarding farms throughout the country have taken a beating since the recession," Taylor said. "I have been very lucky to have a core client base who has been with the farm since the very beginning. The majority of my boarding mares are year-round residents who are

owned by not only owners in Louisiana, but Texas and Oklahoma as well. They love the Louisiana-bred program that provides so

many outstanding incentives for breeders and owner's alike.”

Accredited Louisiana bred thoroughbreds breeders awards provide

breeders with a strong earning potential for their state bred runners.

“If a Louisiana-bred foal hits the board world-wide you can receive a breeder's award,” Taylor continued. “In Louisiana and out of state they are paid out at 18% for a first, second or third-place finish in a stakes race worth \$25,000 and up to \$150,000. The in state breeder's awards also pay out at a 18% level of purse money earned on first, second and third-place finishes at all (4) Louisiana racetracks. That doesn't even include the purse supplements which really enhance the restricted Louisiana-bred races. Here at Channon (Farm) we retain the breeder's rights for life on any foal that we own who is born here. We receive 18% of purse monies for life.”

Taylor has bred several notable Louisiana-bred stakes winners including 2001 Louisiana

Champions Day Juvenile Stakes winner Hail to Bag and 2007 Victoria Stakes winner Ida Marie. Multiple graded stakes winner Happy Ticket, a three-time state-bred champion and winner of the 2005 Ballerina Stakes (G1), also has a connection to Channon Farm.

“Happy Ticket, the all-time leading Louisiana-bred earner with more than \$1,688,838 in earnings was foaled here,” Taylor said. “You become so personally invested in every foal that you bring into the world, and always hope for the best... but little did we know what a success she (Happy Ticket) would become. It was exciting to watch her race. Every year we hope for another Happy Ticket among the new foals.”

Taylor was born in Buckinghamshire, Hertfordshire, England to a non-horsey family who entirely supported her early equine endeavors. At the age of nine, Taylor and her sister Rosemary would ride their bicycles five miles to feed horses at a friend’s farm. Their pay came in the form of riding the ponies—a dream come true for two horse crazy girls. Paintbox the pony was the first mount for Taylor, and was soon followed by a second pony named Katie.

“Katie was a game pony, and I learned to show and foxhunt on her,” Taylor said, reminiscing. “In my early teens it became apparent that I wanted a career with horses. My father got a job in Maryland and we had to leave the ponies behind, however that is where I was introduced to thoroughbreds. It was love at first sight.”

The English rose bloomed in

Maryland horse country. Taylor further honed her riding skills riding show hunters and jumpers at Hillmore Farm in Woodbine. She worked with mares and foals and learned about the breeding side of the business. Taylor became a show person at the thoroughbred yearling sales at Keeneland, Fasig-Tipton, and Saratoga for sales consignor Lee Eaton and other notable farms during the 1980s and 90s.

“I learned from the ground up from some of the best,” Taylor said. “I was getting a great education. It

was a very exciting time to be involved in the thoroughbred industry; a boom time. Yearlings were selling for millions of dollars and stud fees were out of this world... it was surreal. I traveled quite a bit in the early years following the sales. As a result, I started looking for a more stable and permanent position. That is what led me to Louisiana.”

Opportunity knocked and Taylor answered. Mason Grasty, the owner of Foxfire Farm in Alexandria, Louisiana offered her a position

breaking yearlings in 1978.

“I learned so much at Foxfire,” she said. “Not only did I break and train yearlings, but handled stallions as well. After two or three years, I eventually became the manager of the farm. It was a great learning experience and contributed to how I care for my horses today.”

Foxfire Farm was sold in the early 1980s to Susan McCormick, who renamed the operation Lickskillet Plantation and moved it to Greenwood, Louisiana. Taylor went along as part of the deal to continue managing the farm.

“Lickskillet Plantation ran into financial problems and was sold by McCormick after only a couple years,” said Taylor. “For a time it was leased by a group of investors from New Zealand, but they ran into money problems as well. I was urged by clients to start thinking about starting my own farm.”

Taylor’s dream came to fruition when she opened the doors to Channon Farm in 1990 on the former Lickskillet Plantation farmland. She leased the property for seven years until 1997 when she purchased 86 prime acres in

Doyline which became the permanent home to Taylor and her equine residents.

“We bought the farm with a wing and a prayer,” she said. “It was a dream come true. My parents initially gave me the down payment for the farm. Throughout the decades we have managed to keep our business running through all the ups and downs of a very volatile industry. The horse business reflects the economy of the country. We have been very fortunate.”

In the early days Channon Farm became well known for their racehorse rehabilitation program. While

the occasional lay-up still visits the farm for rest and rehabilitation, the breeding and boarding aspect of the business is Taylor’s main focus. She is well known for her attention to detail and adoration of all horses, but has a special fondness for the breeding side of the business.

“I absolutely love the mares and foals,” she said. “I cannot imagine a day without them in it. It is such a joy to wake up in the morning, walk out in the barn and hear the contented mares and foals munching hay, lounging and enjoying life. This is my life, my calling, and I wouldn’t have it any other way.”



Taylor met her husband Roy when he did some carpentry work for her on the farm. His skills come in quite handy with the constant upkeep and upgrading of the facilities. Among his many additions to the farm, he built the cover for the equiciser.

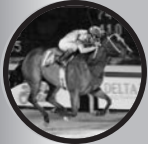

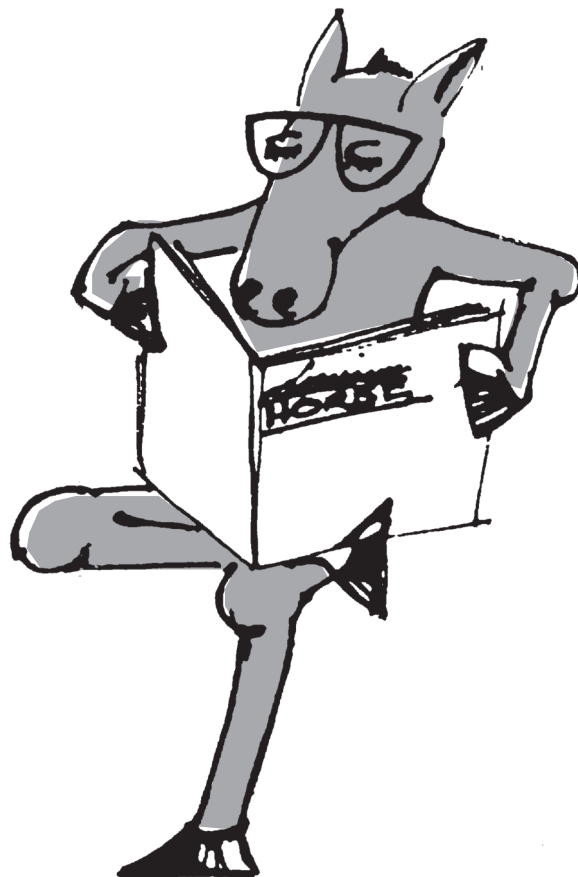

FIVE TIME G1SW AND BREEDERS' CUP CHAMP COURT VISION TO LOUISIANA

Court Vision capped a stellar racing career winning the 2011 G1 Breeders' Cup Mile at six. In all he accumulated five Grade 1 wins from three to six after two graded stakes wins as a juvenile. He won the G1 Hollywood Derby at three defeating notables Cowboy Cal and Pio Ponti. At four, he won the G1 Shadwell Turf Mile Stakes. At five, he was victorious in the G1 Woodbine Mile S. and the G1 Gulfstream Park Turf Handicap. All told he won eight grades stakes and placed in another seven graded stakes, earning a total of \$3,746,658.

Court Vision is by Mr. Prospector line stallion Gulch out of a Northern Dancer line mare Weekend Storm, a half sister to A.P. Indy and full sister to Summer Squall.

Court Vision entered stud in 2012, and moved from Park Stud in Ontario, Canada to Spendthrift Farm in Lexington Kentucky for the 2016 season. A top ten North American first crop sire in 2015, he is among the leading second crop sires of 2016. To date he has five 2016 stakes horses including Nandi Stakes winner Conquest Vivi and Lady Angela Stakes winner, Crumlin Spirit.

Court Vision will stand the 2017

season at Acadiana Equine in Opelousas, Louisiana. His breeding fee is set at \$3,500 live foal.

G1SW LINE OF DAVID TO STAND AT RED RIVER

G1 stakes winner Line of David is moving from Spendthrift Farm in Lexington, Kentucky to Red River Farms in Coushatta, Louisiana for the 2017 breeding season.

At three, Line of David defeated eventual Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver in the G1 Arkansas Derby. He had three wins and a third from seven starts, earning \$662,000 in his racking career.

A son of G1 Haskell Invitational handicap winner Lion Heart, out of Emma's Dilemma, a winning Capote mare, Line of David is a leading third crop sire. Through October 24, 2016, he ranks #21 among North American third crop sires with \$924,028 in 2016 progeny earnings to date. He concluded 2015 ranking #15 among second crop sires in North America.

Line of David is represented by Firing Line who set a new track record in the G3 Sunland Derby and placed 2nd in the G1 Kentucky Derby.

Line of David will be standing as property of a syndicate for a 2017 fee of \$2,500 live foal.

G3 PLACED BASHAAR TO STAND AT INDIAN CREEK

Bashaar, a six year old son of Street Cry (IRE) has retired from racing and will stand stud at Indian Creek Thoroughbreds in

Spearsville, Louisiana for owners Mark and Ashley Dison.

Racing from two to six, Bashaar placed in the G3 Iowa Derby and the Prairie Mile Stakes at three. After a fourth place finish in the G2 Jim Dandy Stakes, he was a favorite going into the 2013 Super Derby. In his racing career, he earned \$163,954 with two wins, three seconds and three thirds from 20 starts.

By the sire of horse of the year and three time champion older mare Zenyatta, Bashaar is out of a stakes placed Dixieland Band mare., bringing Mr. Prospector to both the top and bottom of his pedigree.

Bashaar will stand for a 2017 fee of \$1,000 live foal.

PIMPERNEL TO STAND AT CHEROKEE RIDGE

Pimpernel, a winning son of Elusive Quality will be standing at Cherokee Ridge Horse Farm in Carencro, Louisiana for the 2017 season.

Pimpernel raced in California garnering three wins and two thirds from ten starts, before retiring to stud in 2016.

Bred in Kentucky, Pimpernel is out of the champion North American Dixieland Heat mare Xtra Heat. He is by Elusive Quality, the sire of Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Smarty Jones.

His 2017 breeding fee is \$1,500 with consideration given for stakes mares and stakes producers.

MEAN SEASON RETIRES TO WHISPERING OAKS

Mean Season, a 2010 son of Henny Hughes, has retired to stud and will stand the 2017 season at Whispering Oaks Farm in Carencro, Louisiana for owner Dr. Billy Cannon.

Mean Season was undefeated in his first three starts. He broke his maiden in a maiden special weight at Laurel Park by 4 3/4 lengths. He followed that with an allowance win at Aqueduct by 8 lengths. In his third start, he won another allowance at Aqueduct by 7 1/2 at four, unfortunately sustaining an injury. He concluded his racing career with four wins and a third from nine starts.

Bred in Kentucky, Mean Season is by Storm Cat grandson Henny Hughes, out of a G2 placed, winning daughter of Silver Deputy.

Mean Season will be standing for a 2017 fee of \$2,000 live foal.

SENIOR GUITAR 1ST WINNER STAR GUITAR

Four time Louisiana bred Horse of the Year, Star Guitar, had his first winner at Churchill Downs on Saturday when his Senior Guitar made a bold move turning for home in the long Churchill stretch to take the lead and win by one and a quarter lengths while getting the six furlongs in 1:11.90. Bred and owned by Clifford Grumm, the Louisiana bred is trained by Helen Pitts.

Star Guitar, bred and owned by the Brittlyn Stable of Evelyn and Maurice Benoit, is the all time leading money earner in Louisiana with \$1,749,862 including twenty-four wins with twenty-two of them being stakes races from thirty starts. Senior Guitar is the second starter for Star Guitar, who has

forty-one Two-Year-Olds in his freshman crop. Star Guitar stands at Clear Creek Stud in Folsom, La., his 2016 fee was \$4,000.

CALIBRACHOA HAS FIRST WINNER

Louisiana freshman sire Calibrachoa had his first winner Oct. 20 when Shy Ruston got up in the final strides of a six-furlong maiden special weight at Delta Downs.

The filly is also the third winner from three foals of racing age produced by Shy Baby, a winning daughter of Out of Place. Owned by Brava Stables and trained by Patrick Devereux, Shy Ruston is a half sister to stakes winner Governmentsshutdown (Exchange Rate) and stakes-placed winner Ganges (Gio Ponti).

Shy Ruston was bred in Louisiana by Neal McFadden, who bought Shy Baby for \$16,000 out of the 2012 Keeneland November breeding stock sale out of the Denali Stud consignment. Brava Stables bought Shy Ruston for \$4,500 at this year's Equine Sales of Louisiana 2-year-olds and horses of racing age sale out of the 5B Farm consignment. She has now earned \$25,770.

Calibrachoa (Southern Image) is a multiple grade III stakes winner bred and raced by Nelson Bunker Hunt until November 2010 when trainer Todd Pletcher claimed him for owner Mike Repole. He went on to win the Tom Fool Handicap and the Toboggan Stakes in 2011 and 2012 and finished third in the 2011 Cigar Mile Handicap (gr. I) behind To Honor and Serve and Hymn Book. He achieved a solid record of 10-3-4 in 20 starts.

Calibrachoa stands at Red River

Farms in Louisiana with a 2016 fee of \$2,000.

QUIET AMERICAN EUTHANIZED AT 30

Quiet American, whose champion son Real Quiet won the 1998 Kentucky Derby and the Preakness Stakes (both gr. I), has been euthanized.

Pensioned from stud duties in 2013 at Darley's Jonabell Farm near Lexington, the son of Fappiano was out of the winning Dr. Fager mare Demure and raced in the colors of Sheikh Mohammed.

Bred in Florida by Tartan Farms, Quiet American celebrated his 30th birthday earlier this year April 29. He was purchased for \$300,000 at the 1987 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale by Darley Stud Management.

Lightly raced at 2 and 3, Quiet American rose to prominence at 4 in 1990, winning the NYRA Mile Handicap (gr. I) and the San Diego Handicap (gr. III), defeating the great Bayakoa, and finishing second in the Woodward Handicap (gr. I) and the Charles H. Strub Stakes (gr. I). He entered stud at Sheikh Maktoum's Gainsborough Farm near Versailles, Ky., where he stood until 2006. He was moved at the beginning of 2007 when Darley consolidated its stallion operation to Jonabell.

As a stallion, Quiet American achieved early success, siring 14% stakes winners from foals in his first three crops. His first crop included Hidden Lake, the 1997 champion older female, and his third crop yielded Real Quiet, who was named the 1998 champion 3-year-old colt after he nearly won the Triple Crown, beaten by just a nose in the Belmont Stakes (gr. I).

His other major performers include grade I winners Switch, Seattle Smooth, and Cara Rafaela, plus English and Irish highweight Warrior Queen. Switch, a multiple grade I winner, sold for \$4.3 million at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November select mixed sale.

Additionally he is the sire of four time Louisiana Horse of the Year and all time top earner Star Guitar.. Star Guitar now stands at stud in Louisiana at Clear Creek Stud.

Quiet American, whose stud fee reached as high as \$35,000, sired 54 black-type stakes winners and earners of more than \$64 million.

As a broodmare sire, Quiet American is associated with 83 black-type winners, of which 33 are graded/group winners. He's been represented by six black-type stakes winners so far this year. Among his best are champion and leading sire Bernardini , also standing at Darley, and Horse of the Year Saint Liam. As a broodmare sire, his runners have earned more than \$95 million.

THE JOCKEY CLUB RELEASES 2016 REPORT OF MARES BRED STATISTICS

The Jockey Club today released Report of Mares Bred (RMB) statistics for the 2016 breeding season. Based on RMBs received through October 15, 2016, The Jockey Club reports that 1,423 stallions covered 33,746 mares in North America during 2016.

Based upon historical reporting trends, The Jockey Club estimates an additional 2,000 to 3,000 mares will be reported as bred during the 2016 breeding season.

The number of stallions declined

1.8% from the 1,449 reported at this time in 2015, and the number of mares bred decreased 2.5% from the 34,627 reported last year.

The number of stallions covering 100 or more mares decreased from 105 in 2015 to 100 in 2016. These stallions accounted for 40.6% of the total mares reported bred this year versus 41.8% of all mares bred in 2015. RMB statistics for all reported stallions in 2016 are available through the Fact Book section of The Jockey Club's website at jockeyclub.com.

Further book size analysis shows a 5.4% decrease in the number of mares bred to stallions with a book size of 100 or more in 2016 when compared to 2015 as reported at this time last year; a 15.5% increase in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 75 and 99; a 2.6% decrease in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 50 and 74; a 4.4% increase in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 25 and 49; and a 7.8% decrease in mares bred to stallions

with a book size fewer than 25.

The stallion Uncle Mo led all stallions with 253 mares bred in 2016. Rounding out the top five by number of RMBs were Into Mischief, 218; American Pharoah, 208; Kitten's Joy, 201; and, tied for fifth, Goldencents, Verrazano, and Wicked Strong, 190.

Kentucky traditionally leads North America in Thoroughbred breeding activity. During 2016, Kentucky's 227 reported stallions covered 17,750 mares, or 52.6% of all of the mares reported bred in North America. The number of mares bred to Kentucky stallions increased 1.73% percent compared with the 17,448 reported at this time last year.

Of the top 10 states and provinces by number of mares reported bred in 2016, Kentucky and Maryland stallions covered more mares in 2016 than in 2015, as reported at this time last year. The table below shows the top 10 states and provinces ranked by number of mares reported bred in

LOUISIANA BREDS SHINE IN STAKES ACROSS NORTH AMERICA

The third quarter of 2016 has shown that Louisiana Breds can compete at top levels all across the country. From July through September, Louisiana Breds showed up on the board in Graded Stakes in Kentucky and New York. Additionally, in stakes with purses above \$50,000, Louisiana Breds won at Monmouth Park and Remington Park, as well as placing in stakes at racetracks from New York to California.

Tip Tap Tapizar, a two-year-old Louisiana Bred colt by Tapir out of Counterpoise, a winning Storm Cat mare, ran 3rd in the \$100,000 G3 Bashford Manor Stakes on July 2nd at Churchill Downs. The victory came in his 2nd start after breaking his maiden at the same track in June. He followed with a 2nd in the \$196,000 G2 Saratoga Special Stakes on August 14th at Saratoga. The Steve Asmussen trainee then earned his first stakes win on September 4th at Monmouth Park

as the favorite in the \$100,000 Sapling Stakes for owners Whispering Oaks Farm, LLC. Bred in Louisiana by Summer Hill Farm, LLC, the juvenile has earned \$133,060 thus far racing across the country.

Chocopologie, who ran 2nd in the 2015 G2 Super Derby, won the \$175,000 Governor's Cup Stakes at Remington Park on September 25th. The three-year-old colt by Candy Ride (Arg) out of Highest Class, a Mineshaft graded placed winning mare, was bred in Louisiana by Coteau Grove Farms, LLC. The Patrick Devereux, Jr. trainee put away his competition crossing the finish line 5 lengths ahead of his nearest competitor.

2016 D.S. Shine Young winner Crosscheck Carlos, ran 2nd in the \$100,000 Gold Rush Futurity at Arapahoe Park on August 14th and followed up with another 2nd in the \$100,000 Barretts Juvenile Stakes on September 18th at Los Alamitos Race Course. The bay by Custom For Carlos-Weepnomoremylady, by Summer Squall was bred by Allen Gillette, Jr. and races for owners ERJ Racing, LLC, Slam Dunk Racing and Neil Haymes under the training of Shawn H. Davis.

Believe In Bertie, a three year old filly by Langfuhr out of the Street Cry mare Saint Bertie, ran 2nd in the \$200,000 Indiana Grand Stakes at Indiana Downs on September 7th. Earlier in the summer the Richard and Betram Klein homebred won the Louisiana Legends Soiree S.

Also on the board is stakes across the country for the quarter were Jazz Lady ('14 dkbb.f by Mizzen Mast-April Storm, by Storm Cat) who ran 2nd in the

\$100,000 Bolton Landing S. at Saratoga on August 17th; Ramona's Wildcat ('12 dkbb.f. by Wildcat Heir-Pretty Indian, by Indian Charlie) who ran 2nd in the \$100,000 Open Mind Stakes at Churchill Downs on September 17; Fancy Madelyn ('11 b.f., by My Friend Max-Fancy Dealer, by Barberstown) who placed third in the \$75,000 Brandywine Stakes on July 19 at Indiana Downs; Jack Snipe's ('14 b.g., by Half Ours-Rhodesia) who ran 2nd in the \$75,000 Shakopee Juvenile Stakes on September 17th at Canterbury Park; 2016 Louisiana Legends Mademoiselle Stakes winner Wheatfield ('12 dkbb.f. by Lone Star Special-Thistle Bear) who ran 2nd in the \$50,000 Flashy Lady Stakes on September 15th at Remington Park; and Ed Johnson ('13 gr./ro.c., by Paddy O'Prado-Sassy Gal) who ran 2nd in the \$50,000 Robert Depret Derby on August 6th at Santa Rosa.

FAIR GROUNDS ANNOUNCES 2016-17 THOROUGHBRED STAKES SCHEDULE

Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots has announced a comprehensive stakes schedule with 60 stakes worth more than \$6.79 million for the 145th Thoroughbred racing season at the New Orleans oval scheduled to kick off on Saturday, Nov. 19.

The stakes schedule will mirror several past seasons with a major focus on big event days, including the meet's centerpiece, Louisiana Derby Day, which will include eight stakes worth \$2.36 million, highlighted by the 104th running of the Grade II \$1 million Louisiana Derby on April 1. The Grade II

\$400,000 Fair Grounds Oaks, the Grade II \$400,000 New Orleans Handicap and the Grade II \$300,000 Muniz Memorial will also be run on April 1 along with four additional undercard stakes.

Leading into the Louisiana Derby, Fair Grounds will also host a pair of major stakes days designed as part of The Road to the Kentucky Derby, beginning with Road to the Derby Kickoff Day on Jan. 21. The Grade III \$200,000 Lecomte Stakes will be the first race on the Fair Grounds stakes schedule to offer qualifying points for the Grade I Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands. The Grade III \$125,000 Colonel E. R. Bradley Stakes and the \$150,000 Silverbulletday Stakes will complement the afternoon's action alongside three other undercard stakes.

Five weeks later on Feb. 25, the track will host Louisiana Derby Preview Day. The day's highlight will be the Grade II \$400,000 Risen

Star Stakes that will offer qualifying points toward the Grade I Kentucky Derby and will also include the Grade II \$200,000 Rachel Alexandra Stakes, the Grade III \$125,000 Mineshaft Handicap and the Grade III \$125,000 Fair Grounds Handicap.

Another mainstay on the Fair Grounds Stakes Schedule, Louisiana Champions Day, will be held for the 26th time on Dec. 10. The day will feature 11 stakes races across varying divisions restricted to Louisiana-breds worth a total of \$1.1 million.

The open purse minimum climbed from \$60,000 to \$75,000 this season, and the first three stakes races of the season will be held on Opening Day on Nov. 19, including the \$50,000 Mr. Sulu Overnight Stakes, the \$50,000 Happy Ticket Overnight Stakes and the \$50,000 Heitai Overnight Stakes. The newly created Si Cima Overnight Stakes will be run the

following day on Nov. 20 for older fillies and mares traveling one mile and 70 yards on the main track, and all four of the Opening Weekend stakes races are designed as preps for Louisiana Champions Day.

featuring the \$1,000,000 Delta Downs Jackpot (Gr. 3) for 2-year-olds competing at 1-1/16 miles. Jackpot Day will include eight stakes races and total purse money of more than \$2.3 million.

The \$1,000,000 Delta Downs Jackpot is expected to once again be part of Churchill Downs 'Road to the Kentucky Derby' series of races. The Jackpot race has produced a total of eight starters for the Kentucky Derby since 2012 when Churchill Downs first implemented its qualifying system that features points of 10-4-2-1 to the top four Jackpot finishers. Since its inception in 2003 the Jackpot has produced 14 starters for the Derby overall.

Other important races on Jackpot Day include the \$400,000 Delta Downs Princess (Gr. 3) for 2-year-old fillies; the \$250,000 Delta Mile for 3-year-olds and up; the \$200,000 Treasure Chest for fillies and mares; the \$150,000 Louisiana Legacy for Louisiana-bred freshmen colts and geldings; and the \$150,000 Louisiana Jewel for 2-year-old Louisiana-bred fillies.

Delta Downs will also card a pair of important stakes races at the beginning of the season which could have a major impact on the Jackpot Day program. The winner of the \$200,000 Jean Lafitte Stakes on October 22 will get an automatic

berth into the \$1,000,000 Delta Downs Jackpot and the winner of the \$100,000 My Trusty Cat on October 21 will score a bid into the \$400,000 Delta Downs Princess.

OBS JUNE NUMBERS DOWN

Topped by a sale-record \$800,000 City Zip colt, purchased by Frank Fletcher Racing Operations, the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s June 2-year-olds in training and horses of racing age sale ended strong June 17, bringing to a close the 2016 juvenile auction season.

The top-priced colt, out of the stakes-placed mare Successful Sarah (Successful Appeal), worked a quarter-mile during the under tack show for the session's fastest time of :21 1/5.

The price exceeds last year's record of \$680,000 that Charles Chu paid for Valiant Minister

(Candy Ride).

OBS reported that over four days, 637 horses sold for gross receipts of \$18,574,400, down from the \$24,548,500 for 616 sold a year ago. The average price of \$29,159 was the lowest since 2012 and was 27% less than the \$39,851 figure a year ago. The median price of \$13,000 represented a decline of 27.8% and the lowest since 2011. The 200 horses that did not sell represented 24% of the total through the ring.

OBS president Tom Ventura said the June sale results mirrored other auctions.

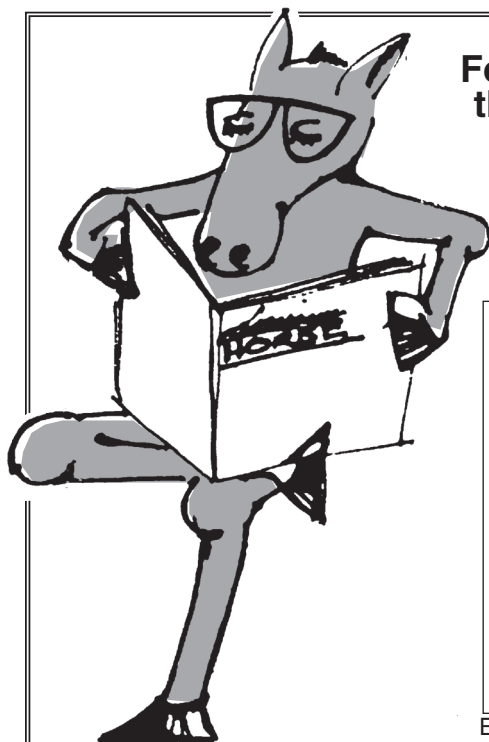
"In general, the 2-year-old sales have had some good years consecutively and it's flattened out," he said. "The June sale has taken tremendous strides the last couple of years and it's hard to keep that pace."

“The first change grants the Stewards the authority to limit the number of starters in a race after consulting the horsemen's group and jockeys if they determine that there are valid concerns that would jeopardize a safe, fair and equal start. Our first priority is safety and it is important that the Stewards have the flexibility to ensure that horses and riders are safe, even if it means that the number of starters may need to be limited,” RCI President Ed Martin said.

The second change clears the way for some possible new wagering opportunities this fall designed to increase fan interest.

Earlier this month, the ARCI approved a change to its Controlled Therapeutic Medication Schedule affecting the regulation of the therapeutic medication Detomidine, a sedative and analgesic used in veterinary treatment of horses. The medication, which is approved for use by US federal government policy, is to be stopped prior to race day so that it is not pharmacologically active when a horse competes.

AAEP FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES FUNDING OF RESEARCH INTO LAMINITIS

The American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) Foundation has announced financial support for two research projects investigating support limb laminitis, in which lameness in one limb results in laminitis in the opposite limb. Subsequent separa-

tion of the coffin bone from the hoof wall causes pain and eventual displacement, either coffin bone rotation or sinking, in the foot.

AAEP members have identified laminitis as the most important equine disease requiring research. Support limb laminitis was the type of laminitis 2006 Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro succumbed to while healing from a severe fracture in a hind limb.

In one study, Hana Galantino-Homer, VMD, Ph.D., Dipl. ACT, at the University of Pennsylvania will investigate the alterations that occur in the protein structure that supports the bone to the hoof connection. Foot specimens from horses affected by support limb laminitis will be used to study how nutrient deprivation and subsequent production of abnormal proteins (keratins) affect the support structures within the hoof. The goal is to understand the process of cell pathology in the foot to better predict, diagnose and treat support limb laminitis.

The second study, led by Samantha Brooks, Ph.D., at the University of Florida, seeks to understand the response of the cells in the support structures within the hoof. By utilizing RNA sequencing, genes that respond to the abnormal support in the foot will be identified and compared to normal feet. Understanding the gene upregulation will help identify the process within the hoof that leads to support failure. The research will use real-time PCR to identify the production of inflammatory mediators and enzymes involved with the pathology.

“The generosity of many enabled us to fund these projects that will advance the knowledge

and help unravel the mysteries surrounding this insidious disease,” said Jeff Berk, VMD, chairman of the AAEP Foundation Advisory Council. “We are particularly grateful to Starlight Racing partners, whose matching funds challenge in 2014 in memory of its Grade II winner Intense Holiday raised awareness and much-needed funds for the fight.”

Both studies will utilize the Laminitis Discovery Database at the University of Pennsylvania, which has specimens from horses that succumbed to support limb laminitis and from normal horses. The database includes a wealth of information about the affected horses.

Tom Early called the meeting to order and asked Roger Heitzmann to call the roll. A quorum was present and the meeting was ready to proceed with business.

Jake Delhomme led us in prayer.

1. Charlotte Clavier is the President of Stemmans, Inc., supplying merchandise to horsemen who are members of the board, of the association and non members as well. She is also the President of Traders Rest Farm, a commercial breeding, training, and boarding facility that does business with members of the board, the association, and non members of the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association (LTBA). She is noted as the President of Stemmans Inc. Horse Sales; however the sale company hasn't held a sale in several years. Her final notice is that she is the Treasurer of the non-profit Racetrack Employee Assistance Program (REAP).
2. Neal McFadden is retired from his previously listed business with the exception to the following. Neal owns in partnership with, and boards mares with Jay Adcock's Red River Farm. He is also in stallion partnerships with board members Nathan Granger and Jim Montgomery. Neal also owns shares in Equine Sales Company.
3. Val Murrell is the President of Clear Creek Stud. Clear Creek Stud is a commercial breeding, boarding, breaking, training and foaling facility that does business with board members, association members and non members of the LTBA. His daughter and farm manager, Michele LaVoice also serves on the board of the LTBA. Clear Creek also owns horses that participate in racing at Louisiana tracks.
4. Jay Adcock is the owner/operator of Red River Farm. Red River Farm is a commercial breeding farm in Louisiana that breeds mares for many different people and entities of which some are LTBA members. Red River farm also sells thoroughbreds commercially at public sales in Louisiana as well as other states. Jay revealed that board members who own shares in stallions at Red River include, Neal McFadden, Jim Montgomery, Nathan Granger and Jake Delhomme. He is also a shareholder in Equine Sales Company.
5. Bobby Duhon notified that fellow board member Brett Brinkman was his trainer and they were partners in several horses. He also indicated that he was half breeder with Clear Creek Stud (Val Murrell) on a Custom For Carlos baby.
6. Brett Brinkman informed the board that he was the owner/operator of La Mesa Stallions, a commercial breeding, boarding, foaling, and etc. operation. He is the trainer of a public stable in which he trains for many members of the association. He also has family mem-

bers in the association as well as on the board (Charlotte Clavier) through marriage.

7. Michele LaVoice is the daughter of fellow board member Val Murrell. She is also employed as his farm manager and participates in the breeding industry.
8. Jim Montgomery with his wife Natalie is the owner of Montgomery Equine. Montgomery Equine is a complete commercial facility participating in all facets of the industry. He owns a share in Equine Sales Company, and participates in the breeding of thoroughbreds in partnership with Jay Adcock as both stallion owners and mare owners.
