It is always exciting to see accredited Louisiana Breds compete at home and on a National level. Since the last issue of Louisiana Horse, the Louisiana Throughbred Breeders Association can boast of several accomplishments on that level.

The most striking is recent Grade I Stakes Winner, Big World, who won the \$300,000 G1 La Troienne Stakes at Churchill Downs in May. The Louisiana bred filly (Custom For Carlos-Tensas Wedding Joy) who is now reported to be headed to the sales ring at Fasig Tipton November, has amassed \$629,190 in earnings. I will be eagerly anticipating her bringing a healthy price tag at that sale. And now, her full brother Gracida has won at first asking in a \$60,000 Maiden Special Weight at Del Mar proving the strength of this pairing.

Of course Louisiana Legends Night on July 8, showcased the best of Louisiana Breds competing against each other. This is always an exciting evening of racing when the most talented runners compete.

Recent months have seen Louisiana bred runners win all across the country. On July 22nd, Janae, a two-year-old Closing Argument filly won the filly division of the Texas Futurity at Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie Texas, and a two-year-old Star Guitar colt, Ace Guitar nearly caught the winner of the colt division. On the same day, another Star Guitar juvenile colt, Givemeaminit ran a game second in an \$83,000 Maiden Special Weight at Saratoga. Inveniam Viam a five-year-old Half Ours mare won the Ellis Park Turf Stakes in

Kentucky, July 8. Too numerous to name them all, Louisiana breds have shown up in Allowance and Maiden Special Weight winners circles at Arlington Park, Canterbury Park, Del Mar, Lone Star Park, Prairie Meadows, Thistledown, in recent weeks.

Louisiana Breds continue to do well at the sales. At OBS Spring Two-Year-Olds Sale in April, 14 Louisiana breds sold for total of \$1,154,000, (\$82,429 average). Three Louisiana breds sold for prices topping \$100,000: a colt by Northern Afleet-Skip Queen sold for \$300,000, a colt by Into Mischief-Love Catcher sold for \$260,000, and a filly by Soldat-An Absolute Ten sold for \$120,000.


And here in our home state, the Equine Sales Company Two-Year-Olds and Horses of Racing Age Sale showed significant increases in average and median, while buy backs dropped and a new record was made for a two-year-old at the sale. The average jumped 37.1% from \$14.811 in 2016 to \$20,300 in 2017. Median increased 13% from \$11,500 in 2016 to \$13,000 in 2017. The record price for a two year old in the sale boomed from the previous high \$69,000 in 2014 to \$110,000 for a Louisiana bred daughter of Flat Out.

The upcoming Equine Sales Select Yearling Sale has 214 yearlings cataloged. The catalog is full of truly impressive pedigrees. I would not be surprised to see more records set at this sale. The Louisiana sales (first with Breeders Sales Company of Louisiana, and now Equine Sales Co.) have been the source of many bargains over the years. A recent example is Mr. Al's Gal. The Salute The Sarge filly sold through the 2015 Equine Sales Mixed sale for a meager \$1,000. She has now earned \$267,680 and was voted 2016 Louisiana Bred Champion Two-Year-Old Filly.

As we are all aware, there is still no turf racing at Evangeline Downs due to the condition of the grass course. LTBA is working diligently along with the Louisiana HBPA and Louisiana Racing Commission to move Evangeline Downs to remedy this problem. In the mean time, The Louisiana Racing Commission has approved the transfer of six turf races to Harrah's Louisiana Downs. The Louisiana Legends Turf Stakes and the Louisiana Legends Starter Stakes were both run at the Bossier City oval on Monday, July 17. The John Henry Stakes and Opelousas Stakes will run on Saturday August 5 in conjunction with Louisiana Cup Day, and the Tellike Stakes and Need For Speed Stakes will run September 9, all at Louisiana Downs.

I encourage everyone to be actively involved in all aspects of our industry. Come to the races; come to the sales; bring your family and friends; the more interest we can generate, the better for all of us.

Louisiana Legends Turf. The son of Paddy O Prado was bred in Louisiana and defeated five rivals in the mile and one-sixteenth turf stakes.

Jockey Colby Hernandez guided Trust Factor to victory, covering the first quarter mile in :23.48 and the half-mile in :47.22. He turned back a solid challenge from Eden Grey's Kitten.prevailing as the evenmoney favorite in a final time of 1:41.56.

Trainer Mike Maker was enjoying the cooler weather in upstate New York preparing his runners for the upcoming Saratoga meet, but certainly enjoyed watching his charge win the first stakes of his career.

"He faced a very competitive field at Arlington and didn't care

for the soft turf," said Maker. "I am glad that they were able to move the turf races to Louisiana Downs and give him a chance to run in statebred company. He liked the firm turf and Colby gave him a very good ride."

Eden Grey's Kitten ran a game second under Roberto Morales.



End Zone Athletics' Farmerville drew clear late to capture the \$50,000 Louisiana Legends Starter Stakes.

Trained by Karl Broberg, the 6year-old son of Richter Scale out of the Gift of Gib mare Very Gifted was making his 28th career start and picked up his sixth win.

Timothy Thornton was the winning pilot, breaking from the far Trained by Steve Flint, the 5-yearold son of Kitten's Joy had won two in a row, including the \$60,000 Costa Rising at Fair Grounds. Social Misfit, from the barn of Karl Broberg, closed for third, followed by Benwill, Well's Gold and Impressive Student.

This was the fifth win from 10

starts for the gray colt, who earned \$60,000 this afternoon, boosting his career bankroll to \$184,060. Maker added that one mile might be the optimum distance for Trust Factor, but said that several options are on the table for his next start.

outside post and angling his mount directly behind pacesetting Flit in Time. He covered the half-mile in 49.13 before taking command at the top of the stretch and drawing off to win by a margin of 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> lengths. The final time of the 7 ½ furlong race over a firm turf course was 1.30.77.

"I've ridden him several times and know he can be kind of aggressive early," said Thornton. "Karl took the blinkers off and he ran comfortable fractions today and did it within his means. He's a nice horse!"

Farmerville, sent off as the second betting choice, returned \$6.20, \$4.40 and \$2.60 across the board. His winner's share of \$30,000 boosted his career earnings to \$167,500. Flit in Time with Diego Saenz aboard, held for second with post-time favorite Southern Minister, ridden by Kerwin Clark was third. B Brazin ran fourth followed by Howe Amazing.

An inquiry was posted when the tightly bunched field of six entered the first turn and Valseunseated rider Alexander Castillo. The stewards review determined that Valse took a bad step, and no action was taken. Both horse and rider were not injured. Crooked As Can Be, One Survivor and Mitchnjohnny were early scratches.

### **STAR GUITAR**

Class, consistency, durability and soundness are all desirable traits in a stallion prospect, and few Louisiana stallions embodied those traits during their racing careers better than Star Guitar. A four-time Louisiana Horse of the Year while racing for his breeders, Brittlyn Stable's Evelyn and Maurice Benoit, the Clear Creek Stud stallion is now passing on his characteristics to the next generation in promising fashion and is the current leader of the Louisiana second-crop sire list by both winners and money earned with 13 winners and \$408,981 in progeny earnings to his credit so far this year.

The leading Louisiana-bred money earner of all time, Star Guitar racked up \$1,749,862 while winning 24 of his 30 starts. He was a stakes winner from ages 2 through 7 and ended up with 22 trophies from added-money events, winning stakes races on both dirt and turf. Among his many accomplishments, he won the Louisiana Premier Night Championship Stakes four consecutive times (2009–2012), the Louisiana Champions Day Classic Stakes three consecutive times (2009–2011) and the Evangeline Mile Handicap three consecutive times (2009–2011); he also set a track record of 1:43.71 for a mile and one-sixteenth at Evangeline Downs. Retired from racing in 2012, he is now honored by a stakes race named for him at the Fair Grounds.

Much of Star Guitar's ability is the legacy of Quiet American, who was euthanized in October of last year after a long and honorable life. The son of Fappiano and the Dr. Fager mare Demure was one of the most closely inbred horses around, his pedigree showing crosses of 3x2 to Dr. Fager and 4x3 to Tartan Farms foundation mare Cequillo, but he was of the best milers of his time, winning the 1990 NYRA Mile Handicap (G1) and defeating the great mare Bayakoa in the 1990 San Diego Handicap (G3). Following his retirement, he became a good stallion, his 54 stakes winners including 1997 Kentucky Derby (G1) and Preakness Stakes (G1) winner Real Quiet, sire of 2007 champion sprinter Midnight Lute; 1997 champion older female Hidden Lake; multiple Grade I winner Switch; and 1995 Hollywood Starlet Stakes (G1) winner Cara Rafaela, dam of 2006 champion 3-year-old

male and important sire Bernardini.

On his dam's side, Star Guitar has solid Louisiana roots. His dam Minit Towinit, also a Brittlyn Stable homebred, was a two-time stakes winner in Louisiana-bred restricted company and also produced Louisiana stakes winners Favorite Minit (by Favorite Trick) and Grand Minit (by Grand Slam) before her death in the summer of 2005, a few months after Star Guitar's birth. She was sired by 1990 Count Fleet Sprint Handicap (G3) winner Malagra (by Majestic Light), one of three graded stakes winners produced by the grade III-winning Viceregal mare Regal Gal. Malagra did well as a stallion in Louisiana and is best known for his daughter Hallowed Dreams, who tied Citation's then-extant modern-day record of 16 straight wins while racing primarily in Louisianabred stakes company.

A full sister to three-time Louisiana-bred stakes winner Lettuce Loose, Minit Towinit is out of Roaring Fireplace, a winning daughter of the stakes-winning Damascus horse Silent Dignity. Roaring Fireplace, in turn is out of the winning Iron Warrior (by Native Dancer) mare Fire Place Girl, a half sister to stakes winner Palmers Son. The female line traces back to Ornament, a full sister to the unbeaten English Triple Crown winner Ormonde and dam of the great English race mare Sceptre.

Star Guitar is getting plenty of support from breeders, not least owner Evelyn Benoit. Doing some seri-



ous shopping at last year's Keeneland November mixed sale, the Louisiana horsewoman paid a total of \$1.4 million for Grade 2-placed multiple stakes winners Moment of Majesty and Five Star Momma specifically to breed them to her stallion; in 2016, she paid \$500,000 for 2010 Canadian Oaks winner Roan Inish as a mate for the horse. Brittlyn Stable also kicked off Star Guitar's stud career by offering a bonus of \$50,000 to anyone who breeds an American Grade 1 winner by the stallion, \$25,000 for an American Grade 2 winner, \$15,000 for an American Grade 3 winner and \$10,000 for a winner of the Louisiana Champions Day Classic.

Both Moment of Majesty and Five Star Momma have checked in foal to Star Guitar in 2017, and there is plenty of anticipation regarding their foals, as well as the ones that have been arriving this spring. "He puts out a nice-sized foal that is put together well," says Val Murrell, general manager at Clear Creek Stud. "They're like him, not flashy to took at—some people would call them plain. But they're really correct, they have good minds and they're more than willing."

To date, the leading light among Star Guitar's foals

is Bermuda Star (Bermuda Bride, by Runaway Groom), who took the Equine Sales Oaks on May 5 after being purchased by Brittlyn Stables for \$20,000 from the 2016 Equine Sales of Louisiana 2-year-olds in training sale. Star Guitar has also been represented in 2017 by stakes-placed Rose Guitar (Rose Hunter, by Jade Hunter) and Shamrock Star (Indian Treaty, by Eugene's Third Son), and had his first 2-year-old winner of 2017 on June 24 when Aceguitar blew away a maiden special weight field at Lone Star Park by nearly nine lengths. Produced from Cherub Heart, by Dehere, Aceguitar removed any doubts over whether Star Guitar could sire speedy juveniles, hanging up a time of :58.70 for five furlongs after cutting out fractions of :22.65 and :46.08.


As the results above indicate, Star Guitar appears to be working with mares from a wide variety of bloodlines, but the bulk of his winners are coming from mares returning his own male line, that of Mr. Prospector, and more should be coming from his first couple of crops given that Star Guitar himself got better as he aged. Given his fine early results, there is every reason to think that the Star Guitars will be rocking Louisiana racing for a long time to come.



to spare, jockey Florent Geroux guided Big World in for the win.

Following Big World's G1 La Troienne victory (undefeated in her first three starts of 2017), owner Maggi Moss said of her, "I really can't describe, in words, the respect and love I have for this truly sweet amazing filly, but to thank Tom Amoss (Big World's trainer) for taking such great care of her and Florent Geroux for an amazing ride."

Hall of Famer, Tom Amoss (nicknamed Famous Amoss) elaborated on the race, "I saw some speed in the race, so I left it up to Florent. He made the front end and was able to control it up there, and that made all the difference. I've had her all winter long. I can't thank Maggi Moss enough to have the opportunity with this filly. She's responsible for buying this filly, not me. We just put her in the right spots."

Amoss added, "I classify Big

World's win in the G1 La Troienne as one of the biggest thrills of my training career and believe I can speak for Maggi when I say it was one of her biggest thrills in racing."

### **Famous Amoss**

Anotice of New Orleans, Tom Amoss is a veteran trainer in the arena of Thoroughbred horse racing, and was recognized for his contributions to the sport when he was inducted into the Fair Grounds Hall of Fame in 1998.

Widely known for his love of the sport, Tom discovered his passion at the age of just 13, when he joined a childhood friend, Al Stall Jr. and his father Al Sr. on a trip to the Fair Grounds. And, it wasn't long after that moment of realization that he began working as a stablehand for legendary horse trainer Jack Van Berg.

After graduating from high school, Tom went on to attend Louisiana State University. But, the horses were still calling out to him, so during his summers off he worked for another New Orleanian, Frank Brothers (winner of three Triple Crown races). After he obtained his degree in marketing, Tom made the move to Louisiana Downs where he continued to work for Brothers.

Yearning to learn every aspect of the racing industry, Tom eventually took a job as a veterinarian assistant. After gaining invaluable experience in how to properly take care of horses, Tom return to the backside as an assistant trainer for Larry Robideaux. From there, he moved to Chicago with his wife, Colleen, but his time in the Windy City was short lived, as his family was on the move again after a call from New York's hot shot trainer, John Parisella (step-father of Bethenny Frankel).

Under Parisella, Tom was left in charge of taking care of most of the horses. But, following the challenging season (and a few more moves), Tom decided that it was time to make a name for himself. So, in 1987, he and his family returned to Louisiana, where he took out his trainer's license.

Things started off bittersweet for Tom, when a local owner gave him a shot with one of his best horses, Tom eagerly entered the horse into a stake, along with another from the barn. Well, the good news was that one of the two horses won the race, the bad news—it wasn't the owner with the "better" of the two horses (his ran fifth). Subsequently the owner fired him.

Tom's luck soon changed, when he received a phone call from businessmen and one of the most revered thoroughbred owners in Louisiana, John Franks. John offered Tom a chance to train horses for him, an offer he quickly jumped on. A decision that has been proven wise, as he has since won nine trainer titles, over 88 Million in earnings and more than 3,200 races.

A large part of his success as a horseman is due to his business approach. Tom once even boasted, "I'll claim off anyone except my good friend Al Stall." Yes, the very friend who invited him to the Fair Grounds for the first time as a boy. "I immediately fell in love with her [Big World], for she was a sensational looking filly that just had a look about her that intrigued me."

Amoss' claim game, pure hustle style and desire to always win and make a dollar has attracted a wide range of owners over the years. One of the most "profitable relationships" has and continues to be with Big World's owner, Maggi Moss.

### **On Maggi's Farm**

Make no mistake, while Maggi Moss is nothing like the tyrannical character depicted in the infamous Bob Dylan song "Maggie's Farm", she is the boss. Back in 2004, she had a few horses at the Fair Grounds, but was having a difficult time finding a trainer that met with her "objectives and values."

But, as fate would have it, Tom Amoss had just read an article about her, and gave her a call: "Ironically, I remember it, for I was driving to a hearing in front of the West Virginia Racing Commission. We had a great conversation, and I asked him to take the horses I had at Fair Grounds. Everything we discussed was exactly what I was looking for moving forward."

While Big World got her start at McKathan Brothers in Ocala, Florida (the stomping grounds of American Pharoah), Amoss would come back into play with Big World, after a run at Saratoga with Anthony Dutrow.

Maggi explained, "The folks in Ocala felt she was a truly talented filly. She had great success in NY and I decided to give her a break since she was only two. Tom is my main trainer and has the majority of my horses. I felt that since she was a Louisiana bred, it was the right decision to give her to Tom for Louisiana racing."

When asked about her first impression of the Louisiana bred horse, Maggi recalled, "My agent (Patti Miller of EQB equine in PA) called me from OBS August 2014, and told me she loved a LA bred by Custom for Carlos. I was interested, since I do buy Louisiana breds." But, when her agent told her what she thought Big World would cost, Maggi explained, "I thought she had lost her mind." She went on, "I was extremely reluctant to buy a LA bred by this sire."

However, her agent then sent her a picture of the filly as a yearling: "She not only looked like a two year old, but had a presence about her that I had seldom seen in young horses. I immediately fell in love with her, for she was a sensational looking filly that just had a look about her that intrigued me. When I saw her for the first time at Saratoga, she had that same look, she is not only beautiful, but a truly lovely personable filly."

Comparisons are seldom fair, but are inevitable when athletes are involved. And, Big World is no exception, but she is in solid company. Maggi gushed, "I have truly been blessed to have some wonderful horses. I owned So Many Ways, (winner of a Grade 1 at Saratoga), and Big World is a lot like her. Both fillies are incredible personalities that are so sweet and personable in the barn, and are all heart on the racetrack. Obviously, Big World ranks as one of the best horses I have owned."

As for what's next for Big World, Maggi believes, "At this point, she truly owes me nothing. She far exceeded my expectations, and my hope is she stays safe and happy. I have entertained some amazing offers for her, and I'm just enjoying owning her right now. She will stay in graded company this year, and then I will have to make the tough decision as to whether to sell her in KY in November or keep her."

Whatever the future may hold, Moss and Amoss' latest achievement with Big World, has exceeded all expectations indeed. Big World's record has been boosted to seven wins in eleven starts, with a total of \$608,820 in earnings. But, money aside, Big World has done something truly important for Louisiana horses in becoming the first Louisiana bred G1 winner since 2005, and her victory will remain present in minds for years to come.

# The Right Stuff... And a Little Luck

David Meche of Muscadine Farm stresses the importance of the right combination of equine pedigree and conformation with a sales team that makes sure the right people see a horse in order sell well in the commercial market.

**44** Going once, going twice, as the hammer fell for the final time and the Curlin colt out of the Yes It's True mare Real Clever Trick sold to Wheels Up Partnership for \$260,000 at the 2016 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. David Meche, the breeder and coowner of the well-conformed weanling colt found it hard to contain his enthusiasm.

"Now that gives you incentive to keep breeding a good horse," said Meche, a financial analyst and entrepreneur who is also the owner of Muscadine Farm in Sunset. "We (the co-owners and Meche) knew that the colt was very nice... great conformation, good pedigree and a super mover... but we had no idea that he would sell that well. Any time you breed a horse you just never know what you're going to get. We got lucky with the Curlin weanling-he had all the right stuff. We also had a very good consignor, Four Star Sales, who made

certain that he got noticed by all the right people."

Meche maintains a positive philosophy for selling horses that can turn a healthy profit in the commercial sales ring.

"Breed to the best that you can," he said. "If you need partners to buy a better mare or breed a better foal, find someone you can trust to join the team. When the time comes to sell make certain that you have a consignor who can get the right people to look at your horse. It is important that your horse doesn't get lost in

the crowd. A consignor can also help your horse regarding placement in the sale. It doesn't matter where that horse is raised... Louisiana, Kentucky, wherever. What matters is conformation, the catalog page, the consignor, x rays and scope results, and timing. There is no magic formula, but sometimes it all just comes together. As it turned out, we were very fortunate when we bought Real Clever Trick carrying the Curlin foal."

Real Clever Trick was purchased by Meche and partners at the 2015 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale from the consignment of St. George Sales for \$80,000. Sired by Yes It's True out of the stakes winning Court Trial mare Blues Court, Real Clever Trick is a half-sister to stakes winner Backed in Blue. She is the dam of Grade 2 stakes winner Vexor, by Wildcat Heir, and two other winners.

"It will be exciting to follow

the Curlin colt's career," said Meche. "His dam, Real Clever Trick, is in foal to Into Mischief, and we are really excited to see what she produces next spring. We have added a couple additional mares with commercial bloodlines; quality over quantity."

Meche is also the co-breeder (along with William Whitney) of the 2009 champion Louisiana-bred filly The Rumor's True. Sired by Kafwain out of the Alwasmi mare Awasarumor, The Rumor's True compiled three wins out of 19 starts for earnings of

\$275,277 including victories in the 2009 Happy Ticket Stakes, Louisiana Futurity and John Franks Memorial Sales Stakes.

"She (The Rumor's True) was a really nice runner who matured early," Meche reminisced. "She really peaked as a two-year-old and it was exciting watching her run. It was a wonderful honor for us as a breeder when she was named champion in 2009."

Meche and his wife Melissa campaigned the hardknocking stakes winner Fappiano's Star, winner of the 1994 Louisiana Handicap. The tough and durable son of Fappiano notched 13 wins out of 49 starts to his credit. Fappiano's Star broke his maiden as a threeyear-old and finished sixth in the 1993 renewals of the Hawthorne Gold Cup (G2) and National Jockey Club Handicap (G3) before falling through the ranks into claiming company.

"Fappiano's Star was a game horse. He gave us many exciting days at the racetrack, especially when he won the Louisiana Handicap. I still have that win photo hanging in my office. He probably didn't have much a possibility of making it as a stallion around here unfortunately due to the fact he was bred to run a route, but I understand he did become a successful sire in South America."

After his racing days were over, Fappiano's Star was sold to Puerto

Rico where he sired three Puerto Rican champions. He died in 2007 at Potrero Los Llanos in Puerto Rico "due to complications from a kidney condition" at the age of 19, as reported on Thoroughbredtimes.com. He was a two-time leading sire in Puerto Rico and sired 102 winners from 137 starters (among 222 foals in 9 crops of racing age) for US \$5,021,519 in progeny earnings. His stars include Bricola (2000 Horse-Of-The-Year and champion three-year-old filly), Estrella Dorada (2000 champion two-year-old filly) and Borrascoso (2005 Horse-Of-The-Year and champion three-year and champion three-year-old filly).

Muscadine Farm, a boutique Thoroughbred facility situated on 15 prime Louisiana acres, has scaled back considerably on their breeding stock and racing interests to concentrate more on commercial breeding ventures while boarding a few mares and foals for friends.

"The economy in Louisiana has really taken a hit," Meche said. "Breeders have really not had much of a

chance to recover since the recession. It has been one thing after another. We have sold a great deal of our breeding stock and are concentrating on mares with a better catalog page and breeding to a higher quality stallion. Like many who have watched the ebb and flow of the Thoroughbred industry, the reality is you must breed to the commercial horse if you want to sell well.

"The Thoroughbred industry follows the economy of the country," he continued. "Like any other financial venture it merits researching the trends of the market and getting the best advice possible. It is important to have a good team together who are all focused on reaching a successful goal with that sales horse... foaling out the mare, raising a good foal, prepping the youngster, finding a reputable consignor who is work-

> ing in your best interest. The whole game has changed; x rays, conformation, pedigree and scoping are expected to be nearly flawless... which is nearly impossible to have everything in one package all the time."

> Breeding and raising horses is an agricultural pursuit that is labor intensive and unpredictable, but also exciting and rewarding.

> "You really have to love it; raising horses and being a part of this everchanging industry." Meche said. "It is only a matter of time before you

take a hit, and the recovery process can be slow. There are so many factors that come into play when you purchase a mare in foal. The catalog page is just a small part of the equation. Many foals are born with conformational issues that make them a challenge to sell privately let alone at public sale. It is a crapshoot, and a lot of luck comes in to play no doubt. We are fortunate to have our farm manager Rusty, Ruth Ann Higgins, running the farm. She is very knowledgeable and is an excellent horseman. We really couldn't do it without her. Rusty is an important part of the team."

Meche is confident that concentrating on a higher quality mare and commercial stallions is a key to a solid future for Louisiana breeders.

"You have to keep in step with the times, and the times require a better horse if you want to sell commercially," Meche said. "We may not have that golden Curlin colt every year, but our goal is to breed a good horse and hopefully success will follow."

## Equine Sales Company 2017 TWO-YEAR-OLD IN TRAINING INCLUDING RACE AGE HORSES SALE RESULTS

TUESDAY, MAY 9, 2017 • OPELOUSAS, LOUISIANA

Equine Sales Company recorded a significant increase in average and median while setting a record high price at its 2017 2-year-olds in training and horses of racing age sale in Opelousas, Louisiana,, on TuesdY, MAY 9. All told, 41 of 60 2-year-olds offered sold for \$832,300 with an average of \$20,300 and median of \$13,000.

With a larger catalog last year, 60 of 92 head sold for \$918,300. This year's average jumped 37.1% from last year's \$14,811, and the median increased 13% from last year's mark of \$11,500. Buybacks for this year were 31.6% compared to 32.6% last year.

The record price for a 2-year-old at the sale had been \$69,000 from the first year the sale was held in 2014, and that number was easily eclipsed twice with horses from the consignment of Pike Racing, agent. The sale topper was hip 29, a Louisiana-bred daughter of multiple Grade 1 winner Flat Out who worked an eighthmile in a co-fastest time of :10 1/5 on Sunday. The April foal sold for \$110,000 to Keith and Ginger Myers' Coteau Grove Farms. Hip 45, a Louisiana-bred colt from the first crop of Grade 1 winner Violence, brought a bid of \$100,000 from Matt Bowling's Bowling Bloodstock. The January foal galloped in the breeze show.

"I think we have continued to improve the quality of this sale and that shows in the results this year," said Foster Bridewell, sales director. "We are very pleased with the results and are looking forward to our consignor select and open yearling/mixed sales later this year."

All graduates of this sale are eligible for next year's Equine Sales Derby and Equine Sales Oaks to be run at Evangeline Downs.

#### **ENDOMETRITIS IN MARES**

**B** roodmare management can be challenging. Endometritis (inflammation in the uterus) is a common problem, especially in older mares. It is important to get a proper diagnosis and start working on possible resolution of the problem after the current breeding season (if the mare failed to become pregnant), so that she might be able to conceive next year.

Dr. James Bailey, reproductive specialist at Royal Vista Southwest, Purcell, Oklahoma says diagnosis should include biopsy. The biopsy may show an inflammatory cell type that is associated with bacteria or fungus. The mare may have a clean culture, but a biopsy may reveal endometriosis—an inflammatory condition that's not associated with infection.

"Cultures often have some false negatives and false positives. But when we put the culture together with a biopsy (taking a tiny piece of tissue from the endometrium the lining of the uterus) and look at this, the pathologist can tell us whether there is inflammation, and the cell types," Bailey says. "If there are neutrophils amongst the cell types in the inflammation, we usually think there is a pathogen involved. Neutrophils are the white blood cells that fight infection."

Problem mares are divided into two categories—those that have inflammation without infection (endometriosis), or inflammation because of infection (endometritis). "Endometriosis might be residual inflammation from a previous foaling. Sometimes it's due to inflammation caused by semen (post-breeding endometritis)." There may be nothing wrong but the immune system is still in combat mode.

Bailey usually treats these mares and then does another biopsy a month later to see if the condition has been corrected. "Most conditions we pick up on a biopsy are correctible except for glandular fibrosis. The pathologist who reads the biopsy can usually look at the degree of glandular fibrosis and give an estimate of this mare's level of fertility—of her chances of carrying a foal to term," Bailey says.

"We approach the endometriosis (non-infectious) inflammation with a protocol using anti-inflammatory drugs like DMSO, dexamethasone etc. and usually administer antibiotics," he says.

"If there is infection, we can often detect it using small-volume lavage and cytology, and pick up the presence of bacterial or fungal elements. Then with a culture we can usually identify the organism and do sensitivity testing to determine which antibiotic is most appropriate," says Bailey.

"We differentiate between tissue infection and luminal infections (within the uterine space). Long-standing pseudomonas infections are often tissue infections and we think it is more beneficial to treat those mares systemically than with an intra-uterine drug. We may put them on a systemic antibiotic for 10 days. All too often treatment is too short, for these severe pathogens, and the infection comes back," he explains.

The old method was to treat these mares every other day with a uterine infusion of antibiotics, but this is generally not successful when treating certain pathogens. can successfully treat "We pseudomonas, klebsiella, E. coli and streptococcal infections systemically. In severe cases where mares have fluid in the uterus (which may be off-color, and which can be determined by ultrasound), we combine this with lavage and an infusion of antibiotics. We often lavage the uterus with saline, and use oxytocin to help facilitate uterine clearance," he says.

"If we have a couple antibiotics that the organism is susceptible to, we might put the mare on systemic treatment for 10 days and do uterine lavage and infusion until we get the uterus cleared. Sometimes we use 2 different antibiotics that work well together and complement one another—getting much more benefit than with either one alone. Many times, it's like 2 plus 2 equals 7," he says.

It's very important to have an accurate diagnosis. Other kinds of infections that are often seen include yeast and fungi. Yeasts usually grow readily in a culture, but fungal infections can be hard

to grow. "When we see an inflammatory process that we think is involved with an infectious agent and we are not getting anything on culture, we always consider doing a fungal culture. It has to be done on specific media, and it could take 10 or 12 days for the fungus to begin growing," he explains.

"If we find fungal elements, there are some excellent drugs available for intra-uterine use that may clear up some of the worst fungal infections like Aspergillus in mares that in the past were very dif-

#### CHECK MARES IN THE FALL

B roodmare owners should always be thinking about the next breeding season, looking at mares in the fall before they cease cycling. "This is a good time to do a basic work-up on open mares," says Bailey. "Our work-up here at Royal Vista includes palpation, ultrasonic evaluation, examination of the cervix, uterine biopsy, and uterine culture. The veterinarian might also want to culture for anaerobic bacteria as well as fungal infections. This will often depend on the age of the mare, and the problems that have been encountered with her in the past," he says.

"With any mare you've attempted to breed that is not in foal, it's very important to do this in the fall. At this time we would also try to diagnose and evaluate any conformational problems and consider doing a Caslick's. We also evaluate the mare for any cervical or uterine injury, or anatomical problems," he explains. ficult to treat," he says.

When a mare has a uterine infection, there are other medications that can be used in addition to antibiotics, such as fluids that buffer and set bacteria up for the antibiotic to work better. "We have more tools in the cupboard to treat some of these things today. But sometimes a person must be very persistent. One cycle of therapy may not get the cure accomplished, especially in the older mare," he says.

"We have to be thorough in covering all bases. As an example, one mare with klebsiella infection (that the owner struggled with for 2 years), cleared up after one round of 10 days' systemic treatment along with uterine lavage and treatment. Many times failure is not due to improper diagnosis, but to not being persistent enough in treatment," Bailey explains.

"When we get the laboratory data back and see some abnormalities, we categorize them as noninfectious or infectious, and then start making specific bacterial diagnoses and sensitivity tests to know what to treat with."

#### POST-BREEDING INFLAMMATION -

"It's important to examine the uterus for indications of PBE (postbreeding inflammation), or accumulation of fluids," says Bailey. "Usually the mare is just having a bad reaction to the seminal plasma. If the mare is bred by live cover, veterinarians often use antibiotics, lavage, oxytocin, etc. to rid the uterus of unwanted inflammation products—so that when the embryo comes down into the uterus from the fallopian tube at about 5.5 days post-ovulation the uterus will be a good environment for maturation of the embryo."

Dr. Mats Troedsson, Professor of Equine Reproduction and Director of Gluck Equine Research Center savs we know much more now about endometritis than we did 30 years ago. "At that point we thought all forms of endometritis were caused by bacterial or fungal infection. Now we know it can also be simple inflammation caused by breeding. Every time a mare is bred, the semen itself causes inflammation-which is necessary to facilitate clearance of the uterus. The stallion ejaculates directly into the mare's uterus, rather than into the vagina, so there are billions of sperm cells, seminal plasma and debris deposited into the uterus. When the mare is bred naturally there is always some bacterial contamination," he explains.

Even though there are billions of sperm cells in one ejaculate, only a few thousand reach the oviduct and are involved with fertilization. "The rest of the sperm, and the seminal plasma and bacterial contamination, all must be cleared from the uterus. This happens effectively in most mares, within 24 to 48 hours. The inflammatory response to sperm is normal, and this is what triggers the mechanism for clearing the uterus. But about 10 to 15% of broodmares don't clear the uterus effectively; they have a delayed clearance and develop a persistent breeding-induced endometritis. These are the same mares that may easily develop persistent infectious endometritis. If these mares are challenged with bacteria or with semen, they fail to clear the uterus," says Troedsson.

"Persistent breeding-induced endometritis is caused by an

impaired physical mechanism; uterine muscles fail to contract effectively during the peak of inflammation. One of our studies showed this may be caused by over-production of an inflammatory mediator, nitric oxide. This causes relaxation of uterine muscles, rather than contraction. Prostaglandin is another inflammatory mediator that causes the muscles to contract, and we believe that this is what clears the uterus. There seems to be an imbalance between the inflammatory mediator (nitric oxide) and prostaglandin in these mares," he explains.

"The problem can be sidepassed by giving these mares oxytocin or a uterine lavage-1 or 2 liters of buffered saline solutionoften combined with oxytocin, another hormone that causes uterine contraction. Using these treatments we are more successful in getting these mares pregnant than we were in the past," Troedsson says.

Studies looking at social interaction between stallions and mares has shown that frequent teasing and physical contact stimulates mares to release oxytocin, which helps trigger uterine contractions and physical clearance. "If you look at breeding management on most farms, we are teasing the mare once in the morning, exposing her to a stallion for only a short time. These mares are living in a barn or pasture with other mares and don't have normal exposure to a stallion. I think we are creating a potential problem in some mares, and most mares that have a problem would benefit from more stallion exposure," he explains. Teasing more frequently could be helpful.

"There are a few mares that have difficulty in clearing debris from the uterus. It seems like they generate an excess amount of inflammatory fluid, rather than just having a clearance problem," he says.

If you were to get a tattoo for identification, would you have it placed upside down on the inside of your upper lip? If someone tried to do this to you without your consent would you just hold still or would you fight? How would you feel every time someone wanted to see it?

This sure seems like a lot of questions, but when we at LHRA get a new unknown mystery horse in our program this is what we deal with. Maybe it isn't a huge problem – unless you get into a situation where a farm owner snorted up all of the feed money and used the registration papers of over 100 horses for rolling papers. Yes, we have been there.

The past few years have felt like LHRA has been chopping through a jungle of red tape and apathy with a very short, very dull machete. When we looked back at our path the jungle seemed to be closing in behind us. Thankfully we found an oasis, or to put it another way, somebody listened.

The Jockey Club is requiring all foals of 2017 and later to be microchipped. The USEF has mandated that all horses competing in USEF-licensed and/or USHJA-sanctioned competitions with Hunter, Hunter Breeding, Jumper, and Hunter/Jumping Seat Equitation classes not restricted by breed will be required to be microchipped to receive points.

I have reached out to the AQHA to follow suit. I have been to the State Capitol, spoken to the powers that be in the Louisiana Dept. of Agriculture and talked to officials at The Jockey Club many times. It is something that we at Louisiana Horse Rescue have pushed hard for and it will greatly ease the burden on us when it comes time to identify a stolen, lost or unknown animal or owner.

Inserting a microchip is a simple task and reading one is even easier. No more slobbery hands or strained eyes trying to decipher old tattoos. No more mutilated horses whose tattoos have been cut off by unscrupulous owners. A small victory indeed, but it is one that will solve a lot of problems for us.

I would like to personally thank each of our 18,000 members for helping us get to this point. With continued help from LSU School of Veterinary Medicine and the AAEP we will educate everyone we meet about the benefits of Equine identification moving into the 20th Century. I would also like to thank the Louisiana Racing Commission, the LTBA and the HBPA for supporting our efforts to rescue and rehabilitate horses in need. Please join us! #### Freshman Flashpoint Gets His First Winner

Louisiana freshman sire Flashpoint's first runner has eventually became his first winner when Flashy Coop took a five-furlong maiden claiming race May 19 at Hipodromo de las Americas in Mexico City.

The colt out of Cajun Camp, by Forest Camp, was making his fourth start for the ownership entity Cuadra X and trainer Vicente Flores Lomeli. He placed third in his first two starts and came into the May 19 race off an unplaced effort four weeks ago. In breaking his maiden, Flashy Coop stopped the timer in 1:00 2/5.

Bred by Gerard Melancon in Louisiana, Flashy Coop sold through 5 B Farm's consignment at the 2016 Equine Sales of Louisiana yearling sale for \$1,500 to Enrique Cantarell. Cajun Camp has now produced three winners out of five foals to race.

Flashpoint is a 9-year-old son of Pomeroy—Two Punch Lil, by Two Punch, who raced for John Fort's Peachtree Stable. He won the 2011 Hutcheson Stakes (G2) at Gulfstream Park and the Jersey Shore Stakes (G3) at Monmouth Park. He also won or placed in four other black-type stakes. He retired with a 5-1-2 record out of 15 starts and earned \$361,722.

The stallion retired to stud at Brett Brinkman's La Mesa Stallions near Carencro, La., where he stands for \$1,500. Flashpoint has 32 foals in his first crop.

Bind, who was bred by Claiborne Farm and raced by Claiborne and Adele Dilschneider, sired his first winner from his first starter June 2nd as two-year-old filly Meter scored impressively in her debut at Evangeline Downs. Going 4 ½ furlongs against maiden juvenile fillies, she won handily by five lengths.

Meter is out of the War Front mare Gauge and also bred and raced by Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider. In this first start, she broke well and was on the lead at every call winning for trainer Albert Stall, Jr. in a final time of 52.65.

Meter's dam, Gauge, was bred to

the promising new Claiborne stallion Lea and foaled a filly earlier this year.

Bind is a son of the late Claiborne stallion Pulpit and out of the Unbridled mare Check. He is off to a strong start at stud for Jay Adcock's Red River Farms in Coushatta, Louisiana where he stands for \$1,500.

Bind was a talented runner himself, winning his debut by 9 ½ lengths at Fair Grounds while earning a 105 Beyer Speed Figure. A winner at 3, 4 and 5, Bindplaced in the Sam Houston Sprint Cup Stakes, an allowance at Churchill, and ran fourth to millionaire Handsome Mike in the Commonwealth Cup (gr.III) at

#### Keeneland.

A half-brother to Hakama, who placed in the Illinois Derby (gr.III), Bind hails from a strong female family which includes Graded Stakes victors Watch, War Thief, and Prime Meridian. His first foals are two-year-olds this year.

#### Zarbyev, Long Time Among Leading Louisiana Stallions, Succumbs at 33

The stallion Zarbyev died Friday, April 21, 2017, at Chad and Pat White Farms in Benton. The chestnut was 33 years old.

The stakes placed son of Nureyev out of the Blushing Groom mare, Grand Bonheur stood his entire stud career in Louisiana. Zarbyev entered stud in 1989 at William and Pat Borhem's Foxwood Plantation in Belcher.

To date, he has sired 303 starters, 211 winners (70%) with total progeny earnings of \$16,948,152. His progeny earnings place him among the all time leading sires in Louisiana. Zarbyev sired 12 black type winners, including five Louisiana-bred Champions. His top runners include G2 Arkansas Derby SW Zarb's Magic who won 8 stakes while earning \$893,946, as well as 1996 3YO Louisiana Bred Champion Colt or Gelding honors. Zarb's Magic's earnings rank him eleventh among all time Leading Louisiana Bred money earners.

Additionally he is the sire of notable winners multiple stakes winners Zarb's Luck (\$647,744, 2003 4YO & Up Louisiana Bred Champion Male); Zarb's Dahar (\$586,695, 2005 4YO & Up Louisiana Bred Champion Male); Zarb's Ballerina (\$495,440); Zarbycat (\$457,729, 1993 3YO Louisiana Bred Champion Colt or Gelding); Ladyzarbridge (\$437,714); Silky Zarb (\$404,332); Screen Idol (\$283,986); St. Zarb (\$264,810, 2007 3YO Colt or Gelding), etc.

Zarbyev concluded his career at Chad and Pat White Farms where he will be fondly remembered.

#### **Greeley's Galaxy Dies**

Greeley's Galaxy passed away April 20, 2017 at Averett Farm in Loranger, Louisiana after a sudden bout of colic. Greeley's Galaxy had been standing at stud at Averett Farm since the 2013 breeding season.

A 2002 son of Mr. Greeley out of the Ascot Knight mare, Ascot Starre, Greeley's Galaxy was a G2 stakes winner of \$445,222. At three, he won the 2005 G2 Illinois Derby at Hawthorne Park by 9 1/2 lengths earning a 106 Beyer Speed Rating in the process. As a fouryear-old he placed in the G2 San Fernando Breeders' Cup Stakes at Santa Anita.

At stud, he is the sire of 8 crops, 59 winnners, three stakes horses and two stakes winners, to date with current total progeny earnings of \$5,698,427. His most notable runner to date is Cluster of Stars who went undefeated in 7 starts, with four stakes wins including the G2 Gallant Bloom Handincap at Belmont and the G2 Distaff Handicap at Aquaduct, and earnings of \$549,600. Additionally he is the sire of Louisiana Bred stakes winner, Greeley's Wish.

## Political Whit Passes at 24

Political Whit died Wednesday, April 26, 2017, at the age of 24. A 1993 Texas bred by Lines Of Power-Political Parody, Political Whit was a graded placed multiple stakes winner. Mike Whitler, who purchased Political Whit as a twoyear-old in training, owned him throughout his racing and breeding careers.

His stats show a phenomenal career record of twelve wins, 6 seconds and 2 thirds from 23 starts with \$347,190 in earnings, including consecutive wins in the Sam Houston Sprint Championship in 1997 and 1998. In 1997, he ran second in the G3 Maryland Breeders Cup Handicap at Pimlico and the G3 Finger Lakes Breeders Cup Stakes at Finger Lakes.

Political Whit entered stud in 2000. He stood two years each in Texas and Iowa respectively, before moving to Peach Lane Farms in Opelousas, Louisiana where he lived out the rest of his career. He sired 32 runners with total progeny earnings of \$575,687 to date. His tope runner was Political Weapon (2001) who had 5 wins and \$84,171 in earnings, and recent runner Heza Fox who has 6 wins and \$82,300 in earnings through 2016.

He passed at Peach Lane Farm.

This year will mark the 15th anniversary of the \$1,000,000 Delta Downs Jackpot, which is contested at 1-1/16 miles on a dirt surface. The race is the second richest in the country for 2-year-olds and has become a springboard to the Kentucky Derby. Since its inception the race has produced a total of 16 starters, including 10 over the last five years, for America's most historic race at Churchill Downs.

Last year's \$1,000,000 Delta Downs Jackpot, won by multiple graded stakes winner Gunnevera, was part of a 35-race series that made up the fifth edition of the 'Road to the Kentucky Derby' point system. Following his victory at Delta Downs, Gunnevera gained additional qualifying points toward this year's Kentucky Derby with top three finishes in the Holy Bull Stakes (Gr. II) and Florida Derby (Gr. II) as well as a rousing win in the Fountain of Youth Stakes (Gr. II), each contested at Gulfstream Park.

The 2016 Delta Downs Jackpot Day program featured eight stakes races and over \$2.2 million in total purse money. The undercard was highlighted by the \$400,000 Delta Downs Princess (Gr. III) for 2-yearold fillies, which produces qualifying points to horses on their way to the Kentucky Oaks (Gr. I). In 2014, Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas won the Princess with eventual Eclipse Award winning filly Take Charge Brandi after Tepin won the race in 2013. Tepin would eventually amass over \$4.4 million career earnings before being retired just a few weeks ago.

For the fifth consecutive year, Delta Downs will offer a guaranteed \$200,000 Jackpot Day Pick 4 during its biggest day of racing. The wager will include four stakes races anchored by the \$1,000,000 Delta Downs Jackpot and the \$400,000 Delta Downs Princess. Overall there will be eight stakes races during the special 11-race afternoon program.

#### Plaisance, Cox, Geroux Secure FG Meet Titles; Honorable Duty Named Horse of the Meet

Owner Keith Plaisance, trainer Brad Cox and jockey Florent Geroux have secured championship titles at the 2016-17 Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots meet.

Fourteen victories propelled Keith Plaisance to his first meet title at the Fair Grounds, just nosing out defending champion Midwest Thoroughbreds by one victory. His pink and white silks struck at 26%, with 52% finishing in the top three and earning \$330,590. Plaisance's performance was well clear of his nine-win total last season and one better than his 13 victories two seasons ago. His top horses included Pacific Pink, Taleoftheprincess, Sunny Oak, Calamity Jane and My Pal Torres, while his horses were trained by Eddie Johnston and Michelle Lovell.

After finishing fourth last season with 28 wins, the Brad Cox barn went on a tear during the 2016-17 meet, winning 43 races and finishing eight clear of Joe Sharp, whose \$1,525,360 was tops among conditioners. Winning his first Fair Grounds title, the Louisville native struck at a smart 28% and was 62% in the money, while his horses earned \$1,284,270. Assisted locally by Ricky Giannini, the burgeoning barn won at nearly every level, highlighted three-time meet stakes winner Believe in Bertie, who broke two track records over the Stall-Wilson turf course.

Geroux won his second consecutive meet title at the New Orleans oval with 98 victories and \$2,856,618 in earnings. He struck at a superbly impressive 29%, while hitting the board 63% of the time. The native of the Normandy region of France manhandled his opponents, finishing well clear of Robby Albarado in second with 61 wins, with Mitchell Murrill (60) and 2014-15 meet champ James Graham (57) rounding out the top four. His win total dwarfs his 87 from last season, when he struck at 25% with mounts gathering \$3.3 million. Geroux shifts his tack to Kentucky, where he resides with wife Kasey and his two daughters.

Horse of the Meet is determined by a vote conducted of Fair Grounds officials and select members of the media. Farrell, Girvin and Believe in Bertie also received votes.

#### Setback Jeopardizes Hall Of Fame Jockey Romero's Chances For Organ Transplants

A new health condition has caused Hall of Fame Jockey Randy Romero to be removed from the list of recipients for a transplanted kidney and liver.

The new health condition started during his trip to the June 10 Belmont Stakes as a celebrity jockey guest. Romero, 59, is one of the rare persons who has undergone dialysis three times weekly for over 12 years. Besides being particularly tiring, it requires a port placed under the skin, in his case on an arm, so he doesn't need a thick needle stick for every session. The port ruptured while in New York and he wound up in a Garden City hospital Emergency Room. Doctors stemmed the bleeding, stitched and bandaged the arm.

But during his drive back from the airport to the home of his brother, John Romero, in Lafayette, La., he hit another auto from the rear, totaling his car. With no one injured, he made it to John's home and was upstairs in his room awaiting dinner and napping. The port ruptured, this time so violently he bled out and became unconscious.

"My mom (Joyce) came to get me for dinner and found me in a pool of blood," he said. "She saved my life. I wound up in Intensive Care and my blood pressure was like 40 over 20. I nearly bled to death. They had to give me four liters of blood."

Romero was placed on a ventilator to assist his breathing and was unconscious and in critical condition for over a week. The ventilator was successfully removed but he was hospitalized until early last week.

During a career that included 4,294 victories and purse earnings of over \$75 million, Romero broke over 20 bones, suffered third degree burns over 40 percent of his body in a bizarre "hot box" fire, developed Hepatitis C from tainted blood transfusions following the accident, has one kidney and has undergone over 30 surgeries. But the latest injury may be the most serious because he will have to get strong enough to get back on the donor list.

In 2017, 18 students received \$1,500 scholarships; 15 others received \$5,000 scholarships which includes \$4,000 in scholarship funds from The Race For Education's Assets for Independence Program—a federal grant program in partnership with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Administration For Children and Families. Only U.S. students attending veterinary school in the U.S. were eligible for awards through the federal matching grant. An additional 19 applicants not selected for Winner's Circle scholarships are also eligible to received \$4,000 awards through the Race For Education's Assets For Independence Program.

#### H-2B Provision Stays in Congress-Approved Spending Bill

An industry-supported provision that could allow additional foreign, seasonal H-2B visa workers made it through Congress as part of the government-funding bill signed by the Senate May 4.

As the House of Representatives approved the spending bill earlier this week, it now awaits an expected quick signature from President Donald Trump.

Currently only 66,000 H-2B seasonal work visas are allowed to be granted this year, but a provision in the spending bill, which funds the government through the fiscal year that ends in September, would give the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of Labor, the authority to nearly double the H-2B cap when it's determined there is an economic need.

National Thoroughbred Racing Association president Alex Waldrop said the NTRA will now work with the administration to get the H-2B provision implemented.

Horse racing is just one of many industries that relies on the H-2B visa program, joining businesses such as landscaping and seasonal resorts.

Congress in 2016 failed to renew the "returning worker exemption" that permits H-2B workers from the previous three years with clean records to enter the country again without counting against the 66,000 cap. That exemption had effectively raised the number of workers under H-2B from 66,000 to approximately 190,000.

#### New Withholding, Reporting Rules Near Enactment

A document outlining upcoming federal regulatory actions released July 20 by The White House indicates that modernized tax guidance relating to withholding and reporting of pari-mutuel winnings is nearing enactment, the National Thoroughbred Racing Association said.

The "Current Unified Agenda of Regulatory and Deregulatory Actions" describes the Amendment of 3402(q) Regulations providing new rules for pari-mutuel wagering as in the final rule stage.

The regulation, detailed by the Internal Revenue Service and U.S. Treasury in the Dec. 30, 2016 Federal Register in a section titled "Withholding on Payments of Certain Gambling Winnings," accomplishes goals started and spearheaded by the NTRA three years ago.

"We are pleased to see this latest indication that the regulation continues to make its way toward final approval," said NTRA president and CEO Alex Waldrop in a release. "We take nothing for grant-

ed, though, and will continue to work closely with our allies in Washington, D.C., to get this important change completed. We urge Treasury and the IRS to act quickly so horseplayers, the racing industry, and the federal government can all start benefitting from these landmark rules."

The proposed regulations, developed with the NTRA's guidance, clarify "the amount of the wager" to include the entire amount wagered into a specific pari-mutuel pool by an individual-not just the winning base unit as is the case today-so long as all wagers made into a specific pool by an individual are made on a single tote ticket if the wager is placed onsite. The proposed regulations would have the same positive results for advance deposit wagering customers and would not impact how those wagers are currently made.

Currently a \$1 trifecta wheel of 10 combinations is viewed as 10 bets of \$1 each. If a payout of \$600 or more at odds of 300-1 or higher is awarded, that payout must be reported to the IRS. If that same wager pays \$5,000 or more on odds of 300-1 or higher, some of the winnings must immediately be withheld for taxes.

The change would affect how the 300-1 threshold is determined. Under the change, the \$10 ticket in the scenario above would be considered a \$10 wager. To reach 300-1 odds, the payout must be more than \$3,010, which means far fewer big payouts will need to be reported.

The NTRA said the regulations will positively impact a significant percentage of winning wagers, particularly those involving multihorse or multi-race exotic wagers, and result in tens of millions of dollars in additional pari-mutuel churn.

#### Report: R.D Hubbard To Sell Ruidoso Downs

A group of five highly-successful businessmen who are heavily vested in the breeding and racing of American Quarter Horses and R.D. Hubbard have all signed a letter of intent that involves Hubbard selling Ruidoso Downs Race Track and the Ruidoso Horse Sale Company to the group.

The individuals in the group are Stan Sigman, Gary McKinney, Narciso (Chicho) Flores, Johnny Trotter (all from Texas) and John Andreini of California.

Hubbard, 81, bought Ruidoso Downs in 1988 with Dr. Ed Allred, who also owns Los Alamitos Race Course in California. Hubbard later purchased Allred's interest in the Ruidoso facility.

"We are about to start our due diligence, and in due time we will start the process of gaining regulatory approval," said Sigman. "It is our goal to close the deal in the fourth quarter of 2017.

R.D. Hubbard, an internationally acclaimed businessman, has been a leading Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse owner and breeder for decades and has had ownership in such other tracks as Hollywood Park, Los Alamitos, Zia Park, Turf Paradise and The Woodlands in addition to Ruidoso Downs. Hubbard owned a farm in Kentucky for many years and now has his Crystal Springs Farm located just a short drive from Ruidoso Downs.

It has been evident to the board that the purse structure in Louisiana favors the claimers who run at levels of the lower end. Proportionately the lower claimers run for much higher purses that the upper claimers and allowance horses. With that being the case we pay breeders awards on that same premise. In order to combat that problem Roger used the idea Brett Brinkman had suggested and placed a value on horses racing for claiming prices of \$10,000 or less. This value would be one and one-half times the claiming price of the horse. For example, a horse racing for a claiming price of \$5,000 would be awarded on a value of \$7,500, and the breeders awarded would be based on that figure. If this was practiced in 2015 if would have cut the budget approximately \$592,000. After seeing our final numbers it is not recommended that we do this immediately, but possibly look at this in the future if needed.

Discussion then took place about the rules that we had in the past and the rules of the Louisiana Quarter Horse breeders.

Date, Time and place of next Board of Directors Meeting: April, 11, 2017, 4:00 pm at Prejeans Restaurant, Carencro. Louisiana

Before being excused for an Executive Session, Mr. Adams asked why the elimination of the Louisiana Stallion Stakes? The board explained it was cancelled due to lack of participation and the restrictions of the Louisiana funds we use.
